In trauma centers and surgery suites, there are no one-size-fits-all replacements for prescription opioids — narcotic painkillers that range from intravenous morphine and Dilaudid to pills including Percocet, Vicodin and OxyContin. They so rapidly dull a severe pain that patients' bodies become numb as they've become a default in hospital care, to the point where it's almost unexcusable for patients to have an opioid dripping through an IV before they wake from surgery, whether they really need it or not.


The new approach: Mixing a variety of medications, along with techniques like nerve blocks, spinal anesthesia and numbing lidocaine, to attack pain from multiple directions.

"It's not just changing a medication or two. It's a whole culture change."
