FORMAL COMMENTS OF INTERESTED PARTY CITY OF CANTON, OHIO

WHEREAS, Attorney Examiner James M. Lynn has found via his Journal Entry dated October 13, 2016, as follows:

That 1) R.C. 4905.04 provides that the Commission has statutory authority to regulate and promote the welfare and safety of railroad employees and the traveling public; and

2) R.C. 4907.52 provides that when a railroad and street or highway cross at grade, if, in the opinion of the Commission, public safety requires protection, the Commission may make an order requiring the railroad to install such devices as, in the opinion of the Commission, will properly protect such crossing; and

Norfolk Southern Railway Company (NS) is a railroad as defined in R.C.
4907.02 and subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission under R.C. 4905.04; and

4) On July 19, 2016, NS filed a request for Commission authorization to relocate existing warning devices at eleven grade crossings on its Fort Wayne line in Canton, Stark County, and modify warning devices at seven crossings along the same line; and

5) NS seeks also Commission approval to modify the warning devices at seven crossings; and

 Any interested parties have the opportunity to file comments on NS's request and to file comments in the docket; and

Finally, the attorney examiner found that the Commission has no authority over the removal of railroad tracks;

THEREFORE, Interested Party, the city of Canton (Canton), through its City Engineer Dan Moeglin, respectfully requests that the Commission consider the following brief comments on NS's requests:

1. The possible closing of 8th St. crossing NE; according to the city of Canton's newly approved city Comprehensive Plan, the area along the creek is to be converted back to natural area that may include reforestation of flood plains, passive recreation, agriculture, and bike trails. At this time, the 8th St. crossing only serves two residential properties that both have access from 9th St.

2. Regarding the 8th St. closure; the city of Canton would like to have an at grade bike trail crossing somewhere in the area of 8th St. The exact location is not yet determined and is flexible.

3. The Pro Football Hall of Fame Village is in the process of building a \$600 million development that will drastically increase the number of tourists visiting Canton. The city of Canton is working to have Cuyahoga Valley Scenic RR (CVSR) service reinstated to Canton. Currently, Akron Metro owns the line used by CVSR that turns into the NS line. The line used to have dual curve sections that connect to NS. At some point, the EB curve was removed that connected to the NS 3rd track. In addition to seeing CVSR service reinstated to Canton, the city actually desires to have it extended east along the 3rd track to the former Amtrak station at Market Ave. S. to service downtown and the nearby large scale Hercules Residential Development which is under

construction and located in the old historic Hercules engine plant, at the SE corner of the Market/NS crossing. The long term goal is to reinstall the east curve and use the area as a scenic/passenger line. These two major economic developments are currently well underway and include residential/commercial/tourism elements that will greatly benefit the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of Canton and its visitors.

Therefore, the city of Canton respectfully requests that the 3rd track remain in place and in service. Canton would support the removal of the remainder of the 3rd track in Canton. When CVSR service is reinstituted, the EB curve could be replaced.

4. Given the residential nature of the Hercules development and its immediate proximity to the south side of the tracks east of Market Avenue S., the city of Canton is very interested in achieving a Quiet Zone designation for the area adjacent to the development and will work with all parties toward that end.
