Okay. The subject of today's hearing is limited to the application filed by Clean Energy Future on April 19, 2017. The company is seeking to construct a 955 megawatt natural gas fired combined cycle power plant. Clean Energy Future proposes to commence construction in January, 2018 and commence commercial operation by June, 2020.

The Power Siting Board staff filled a report in this case on September 5, 2017.

After conducting an investigation and a review the Staff gave a recommendation to allow the project to go forward, subject to several conditions.

The Staff report serves as a recommendation to the Board, but the Board still has the final decision. I believe Staff members had a copy of that out front. Hopefully you got a copy, if not those should be available.

An evidentiary hearing is scheduled

for September 28, 2017 at 10:00 A.M. at the Board's office in Columbus.

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Clean Energy Future's application and the Staff recommendation are all available on the Power Siting website under this case number, which was 17-530.

The purpose of this hearing is to receive comments from you regarding this application. This is not a question and answer session, rather your opportunity to let the Power Siting Board know what you think about the proposal.

There is a court reporter here.

And I am strongly opposed to another plant being built in 3 Oregon because of the blast zone factor, and 4 5 what the added pressure is going to be to my 6 line. 7 Right now it's going through there 8 at 675 pounds of pressure. And there is a 570 9 foot blast area if it ever caught on fire or 10 ruptured. 11 And right now I can't sell my 12 property because of the new pipeline that just 13 went in last year. Hicks-Hudson, the City Council, I am here to say we wholeheartedly support this project for three reasons.

2.1

One, it's good for the environment and energy diversity.

Two, it's good for jobs, and three, it's a great project overall for northwest Ohio.

The amount of emissions that are being produced at a plant like this are significantly different from other sources of power. And having this type of energy diversity is very important as Ohio and northwest Ohio moves forward going into the future.

Second of all, we are very good at building things with our hands in northwest Ohio. We have very skill workforce. This plant is going to be built well and it's going to create jobs. Not only construction, but long-term for both the cities of Oregon and Toledo and northwest Ohio.

And third, as Mr. McClure mentioned, the project is partially a result of a water deal between the cities of Oregon and Toledo.

Toledo has much excess capacity to be able to produce water. This project is going to need a

1 lot of it, and the collaboration between the 2 cities of Toledo and Oregon show that northwest Ohio is open for business. And if you are a 3 company that has a large water need we will work 4 5 together to meet your needs, and you should 6 seriously consider coming to northwest Ohio 7 because we will help you make it work. I just want to thank Mayor Seferian 8 9 and Oregon City Council for the work in reaching 10 a water agreement that helped make this project 11 possible. Thank you. 12 ALJ WALSTRA: Thank you. of this ground, and was the original person that
had the tile, drainage tile, put in.

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And was curious, the tile main that drains this entire parcel will go right through

where the power plant is proposed. How are they going to ensure the continuation of drainage for the ground that will sit south of that, because it does drain north.

ALJ WALSTRA: Okay. Thank you. I can't answer your question, but perhaps the representatives from the power plant can address you.
