We have helped over 5,000 commercial and 3,000 residential clients contract with REPs (Retail Electric Providers in Texas), helping them obtain lower pricing than they normally would on their own.

For commercial clients, Texzon typically obtains 12 months usage from the incumbent provider through an LOA process and then shops this with one or more providers to get the best price that we can for the client.

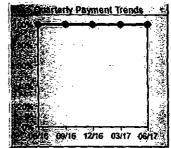

\*Percentage of on-time payments by month.

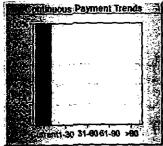


Percentage of on-time payments by quarter
