## **TESTIMONY FOR EVIDENTIARY HEARING**

Now comes the Young Men's Christian Association of Youngstown Ohio ("the YMCA"), and hereby submits a summary of the testimony which will be presented at the Evidentiary Hearing on November 20, 2017.

The YMCA will present the testimony of the Reg Martin, Receiver for Youngstown Thermal, LLC and Youngstown Thermal Cooling, LLC ("Youngstown Thermal") with regard to the employee payroll and health care expenses for Youngstown Thermal for the months of June, July, August, September and October, 2017 and the total amounts collected for the surcharge for the months of July, August, September and October, 2017. Further, the testimony of the Receiver will detail the number of employees at Youngstown Thermal, their job duties and an itemization of their monthly wages and healthcare expenses at the time the motion for receiver was filed and the same information throughout the receivership up until the present time.

Testimony will also detail the amounts of any non-payment of the surcharge by customers since the Receiver started collecting it. Finally, the testimony of toohe Receiver will provide any and all amounts of the collected surcharge which exceeded the expenses for employee payroll and healthcare. The receiver will provide testimony as to the usage of steam by the YMCA for the months of July, August, September and October, 2017. The YMCA will also question Patrick Donlon of the PUCO who will provide testimony with regard to the steam usage of all the Youngstown Thermal customers ("customers") for the year 2017 and further provide why none of that data use was utilized in determining the surcharge. His testimony will also include the amounts of steam usage by the customers for the months of July, August, September and October, 2017. Further testimony will be presented as to how the additional 20% tacked onto the surcharge for late or non-payment by customers was determined by the PUCO. Also, what efforts were made by the PUCO to determine the actual number of employees and amounts of payroll and healthcare expenses instead of relying upon Youngstown Thermal data which its Staff Reports emphasize are sloppy and unreliable.
