As I said, my name is Dan Fullin. I'm the Administrative Law Judge assigned to the case. And I'd like to now begin by having the appearance from the counsel for the Applicant.

MS. BLEND: Sure. Thank you, Your
Honor. On behalf of AEP Ohio Transmission Company,
Inc., Christen M. Blend, American Electric Power
Service Corporation, 1 Riverside Plaza, 29th Floor,
Columbus, Ohio 43215. Thank you.

A.L.J. FULLIN: We also have two people besides myself that are here from the Power Siting Board, Jim O'Dell and Jill Kocher.

What we normally do is we get here early enough that we have a sign-in sheet, but we got off to a little bit late start today. So I figured what

I would just do, the purpose of the hearing today is to allow members of the public to give comments to the Board for the Board's consideration in this case. And what we normally do is have anyone that wants to provide a comment -- it can be a written or an oral comment -- but if you're here to provide the comment live by, you know, oral testimony, then I'll have -- I'll raise my hand and -- ask who wants to testify, have you raise your hands, and then call each of you forward to give your testimony and have you come up here to the front so that the court reporter can hear the testimony. I'll swear you in first, unless you choose not to be sworn in, let me know that. So that's the way we'll proceed and that's the purpose of tonight's meeting.

It's not a question-and-answer session so much as a chance for anyone that already has a comment about the application to make their comment here at today's hearing.

There's also going to be a full evidentiary hearing on this case, and that is scheduled for the Board's offices in Columbus for November 21st at 10:00 o'clock. Normally those that provide testimony at the public hearing are providing their commentary here, and the people that testify at

the evidentiary hearing, that's when the company will put on its case in chief and anyone else that's already been named as a party, which in this case — or an intervenor in the case. In this case, I don't think we have anyone that's entered an appearance as an intervenor. So, again, this is probably the best opportunity for you to provide public comment if you wish to do so.

The subject of the hearing today is the application filed by AEP on January 27th, and it was later supplemented on August 18th, both of this year. The company's seeking to construct a 138 kilovolt transmission line in Belmont County. The purpose of the line is to -- involves upgrading an existing 69 kilovolt transmission line and converting it to a partial 69 kV and a 135 kV line in Pultney, Richland, and Smith Townships. So that's what the Board will end up making its decision based on the testimony tonight, the testimony at the evidentiary hearing, and the application itself.

So with that, I'll get started by asking is there anyone here that wants to testify tonight?

And if so, let me know by raising your hand. If you want to -- I see you raised your hand. If you want to come forward, or you can probably remain where you

are as long as she can hear what you're saying.

Because you're in the middle of the room, you can

probably be heard better from where you're at as long

as she can hear your testimony. If you wanted to

give sworn testimony, I'll swear you in first.

MR. HODOROWSKI: That's fine.

A.L.J. FULLIN: Okay. I guess you should be -- stand to be sworn. Do you swear the testimony you'll give tonight will be the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth?

MR. HODOROWSKI: Yes, sir.

A.L.J. FULLIN: Thank you. If you would begin by giving us your name and address, and maybe whatever affiliation you might have, if you have one.

MR. HODOROWSKI: Okay. My name is David Hodorowski. This is my wife, Wendy. We are at the 65545 McCurdy Road property. It is subject to your alternate route.

We just want to voice our concern with having that alternate route taken. We feel that it will greatly impact the resale property value of our home. We've recently made some very expensive additions to our home, and we're worried about the fact that this would be a third high voltage power line that will not only traverse our property, but

also have a 90 degree turn coming down a second side of our property. I mean, that's basically what we're here for is just to voice our concern, you know, hoping that you will choose the preferred direction of travel for this new high voltage line.
