Dear Property Owner or Resident:

AEP Ohio and its affiliate, AEP Ohio Transmission Company, Inc., invite you to a public informational open house about a transmission line project in your area. The open house is scheduled for Thursday, February 1 at Sardinia Elementary School located at 7742 Tri County Highway in Sardinia. Doors open at 5:30 p.m. The open house will run until 7:30 p.m. The informational open house provides the opportunity to meet and talk with project representatives and view detailed maps. There is no formal presentation. You may come and go at any time.

The Sardinia Area Improvements involves building about 5 miles of 138-kilovolt (kV) transmission line, upgrading an existing substation, and removing about 12 miles of existing 69 kV transmission line. AEP Ohio is seeking input regarding the proposed study segments to determine a final line route. AEP Ohio will need to acquire easements to accommodate a 100-foot right-of-way corridor. This project runs through Eagle Township in Brown County. The new line provides an additional source of power and improves electric service reliability for area customers. The project will use steel single pole structures that will be about 110-feet tall. AEP Ohio anticipates completion of this project in late 2019. Early estimates show this is an approximate \$19 million investment.

The rules established by the Ohio Power Siting Board (OPSB) require AEP Ohio to study multiple routes and to submit two routes for the board's evaluation. Either route will allow AEP Ohio to satisfy its objectives for improving the transmission system. Each route has advantages and drawbacks. The public information meeting will help us determine which route to recommend as preferred and which to recommend as the alternate route.

The OPSB is responsible for reviewing all the information related to the project – including input from the public – and determining whether the facility will meet the suitability and necessity requirements of the siting process. Ohio's siting process requires that proposed facilities:

- satisfy the public need criteria for the facility;
- satisfy all engineering requirements of the project;
- address the compatibility of the facility with existing land use in the area; and
- address the socioeconomic, land use, ecological, cultural and environmental effects of the facility on the area.

The OPSB will make the final decision regarding which route is selected. Members of the public are encouraged to comment about this project. 
