





Please review the following information regarding the East Ohio Gas Company (EOG) Pipeline Infrastructure Replacement (PIR) project, PIR 559 – West High Street and North Sunset Drive. To assist with your review of the project, site maps and photographs are enclosed.

#### **Project Purpose and Location**

EOG is proposing to replace approximately 5,900 feet of natural gas pipeline (twelve [12]inch diameter) under the PIR Program. The purpose of the program is to replace existing pipe with corrosion-resistant pipe to ensure the safety and reliability of pipeline operations.

PIR 559 – West High Street and North Sunset Drive is located in Orrville and Green Township, Wayne County, along West High Street and Smucker Street, and within an off-road easement that extends 30 feet on either side of the proposed pipeline. The latitude and longitude coordinates for the project center point are 40.84681, -81.79254. The project area is indicated on an excerpt of the Orrville, Ohio USGS 7.5-minute topographic map and the project area map, located in Attachment A. Representative photographs of the study area are included in Attachment B.

#### **Study Area Description**

The study area was surveyed on July 7, and September 8, 2017. These surveys were performed to collect information on potential wetlands, streams, and protected species habitat. The study area is located within agricultural and residential areas with land covers of mowed grass, lawn trees, pavement, successional woods, and row cropping.

No wetlands were identified in the project area. However, several off-site wetlands were identified adjacent to the project area.

Two (2) streams were identified within the project area. Stream 1 was assessed at two (2) different reaches as the substrate and surrounding land use varies significantly. Stream 1a is located southeast of the Orrville and Green Township line and crosses the easement at three locations within the successional woods. Stream 1b runs approximately parallel to West High Street on the north side, and drains east into a culvert under the road. Stream 1b within the project area is mowed and captured in a roadside ditch.

Stream 2 drains northwest into Stream 1a where Stream 1a flows southeast off-site. All of the stream crossings will be completed via horizontal directional drilling and therefore no impacts to water resources will occur. Photographs of the streams are included in Attachment B.

The project area was evaluated for potential habitat for the Indiana bat (*Myotis sodalis*) or northern long-eared bat (*Myotis septentrionalis*). PIR 559 is in an agricultural and residential setting with trees of various sizes scattered throughout the project area. No wooden structures occur in the study area.

However, the riparian corridors of Streams 1 and 2, and the successional woods surrounding them, approximately thirty (30) acres in size, could provide roosting and foraging habitat for the listed bats. These woods have been selectively logged and do not provide connectivity to a larger, forested area.

No trees were identified with characteristics that may potentially provide habitat for these bats. Clearing of other trees in the project area may be necessary to safely conduct project activities or upon the directive of a city arborist and can be cleared at any time.

#### **Request for Finding**

Considering the information above, EOG is requesting a finding from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources regarding any adverse effect to any state-listed species and natural areas with ecological and/or geological significance.

A timely response is respectfully requested to ensure compliance relative to state-listed endangered species prior to initiating construction activities. 


Location of Project Area on USGS 7.5-Minute Topographic Map (Orrville Quadrangle)






**Project:** The proposed project involves the replacement of approximately 5,900 feet of natural gas pipeline (twelve [12]- inch diameter) under the PIR Program.

Location: The proposed project is located in Orrville and Green Township, Wayne County, Ohio.

The Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR) has completed a review of the above referenced project. These comments were generated by an inter-disciplinary review within the Department. These comments have been prepared under the authority of the Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act (48 Stat. 401, as amended; 16 U.S.C. 661 et seq.), the National Environmental Policy Act, the Coastal Zone Management Act, Ohio Revised Code and other applicable laws and regulations. These comments are also based on ODNR's experience as the state natural resource management agency and do not supersede or replace the regulatory authority of any local, state or federal agency nor relieve the applicant of the obligation to comply with any local, state or federal laws or regulations.

**Natural Heritage Database:** The Natural Heritage Database has no records at or within a onemile radius of the project area.

A review of the Ohio Natural Heritage Database indicates there are no records of state endangered or threatened plants or animals within the project area. There are also no records of state potentially threatened plants, special interest or species of concern animals, or any federally listed species. In addition, we are unaware of any unique ecological sites, geologic features, animal assemblages, scenic rivers, state wildlife areas, state nature preserves, state or national parks, state or national forests, national wildlife refuges, or other protected natural areas within the project area. The review was performed on the project area you specified in your request as well as an additional one mile radius. Records searched date from 1980.

Please note that Ohio has not been completely surveyed and we rely on receiving information from many sources. Therefore, a lack of records for any particular area is not a statement that rare species or unique features are absent from that area. Although all types of plant communities have been surveyed, we only maintain records on the highest quality areas.

Fish and Wildlife: The Division of Wildlife (DOW) has the following comments.

The DOW recommends that impacts to streams, wetlands and other water resources be avoided and minimized to the fullest extent possible, and that best management practices be utilized to minimize erosion and sedimentation.

The project is within the range of the lake chubsucker (*Erimyzon sucetta*), a state threatened fish. Due to the location, and that there is no in-water work proposed in a perennial stream, this project is not likely to impact this species.

The project is within the range of the eastern massasauga (*Sistrurus catenatus*), a state endangered and a federally threatened snake species. The eastern massasauga uses a range of habitats including wet prairies, fens, and other wetlands, as well as drier upland habitat. Due to the location, the type of habitat present at the project site and within the vicinity of the project area, and the type of work proposed, this project is not likely to impact this species.

The project is within the range of the American bittern (*Botaurus lentiginosus*), a state endangered bird. Nesting bitterns prefer large undisturbed wetlands that have scattered small pools amongst dense vegetation. They occasionally occupy bogs, large wet meadows, and dense shrubby swamps. Due to the location, the type of habitat present at the project site, and the type of work proposed, this project is not likely to impact this species.

The project is within the range of the sandhill crane (*Grus canadensis*), a state endangered species. Sandhill cranes are primarily a wetland-dependent species. On their wintering grounds, they will utilize agricultural fields; however, they roost in shallow, standing water or moist bottomlands. On breeding grounds they require a rather large tract of wet meadow, shallow marsh, or bog for nesting. Due to the location, the type of habitat present at the project site, and the type of work proposed, this project is not likely to impact this species.

The project is within the range of the trumpeter swan (*Cygnus buccinator*), a state endangered bird. Trumpeter swans prefer large marshes and lakes ranging in size from 40 to 150 acres. They like shallow wetlands one to three feet deep with a diverse mix of plenty of emergent and submergent vegetation and open water. Due to the location, the type of habitat present at the project site, and the type of work proposed, this project is not likely to impact this species.

Due to the potential of impacts to federally listed species, as well as to state listed species, we recommend that this project be coordinated with the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service.

DEO is planning to construct and replace approximately 1.16 miles of a new 12-inch steel pipeline which will replace an existing 8-inch natural gas pipeline. The new pipeline will be installed within the existing DEO easements to the north and re-routed to public ROWs along W High Street and Smucker Street to the south.



# **Notice of Proposed Major Utility Facility (New Pipeline Construction)**

Dominion Energy Ohio ("DEO") is planning to construct and replace an existing 8-inch diameter distribution pipeline with approximately 6,100 feet of a new 12-inch diameter natural gas pipeline. The new pipeline will be placed within the existing DEO easements to the north and re-routed along the public right-of-ways to the south. The pipeline project will run in a northwest to southeast direction between Rohrer Road and West High Street, in a west to east direction along West High Street until Smucker Street, and in a north to south direction along Smucker Street up to DEO's Smucker-Border Station in the City of Orrville and Green Township, Wayne County, Ohio. DEO plans to start the construction in April 2018 and to end the project in December 2018.

The Ohio Power Siting Board will review the Letter of Notification in accordance with Ohio Revised Code Section 4906.10(A) which states that the Board shall not grant a certificate for the construction, operation, and maintenance of a major utility facility, either as proposed or as modified by the Board, unless it finds and determines all of the following: (1) The basis of the need for the facility; (2) The nature of the probable environmental impact; (3) That the facility represents the minimum adverse environmental impact, considering the state of available technology and the nature and economics of the various alternatives, and other pertinent considerations; (4) In the case of an electric transmission line, that the facility is consistent with regional plans for expansion of the electric power grid of the electric systems serving this state and interconnected utility systems and that the facility will serve the interests of electric system economy and reliability; (5) That the facility will comply with Chapters 3704., 3734., and 6111. of the Revised Code and all rules and standards adopted under those chapters and under Sections 1501.33, 1501.34, and 4561.32 of the Revised Code. In determining whether the facility will comply with all rules and standards adopted under Section 4561.32 of the Revised Code, the board shall consult with the office of aviation of the division of multimodal planning and programs of the department of transportation under Section 4561.341 of the Revised Code; (6) That the facility will serve the public interest, convenience, and necessity; (7) In addition to the provisions contained in divisions (A)(1) to (6) of this section and rules adopted under those divisions, what its impact will be on the viability as agricultural land of any land in an existing agricultural district established under Chapter 929 of the Revised Code that is located within the site and alternative site of the proposed major utility facility; rules adopted to evaluate impact under Division (A)(7) of this section shall not require the compilation, creation, submission, or production of any information, document, or other data pertaining to land not located within the site and alternative site; and (8) That the facility incorporates maximum feasible water conservation practices as determined by the board, considering available technology and the nature and economics of the various alternatives.

Affected persons may file comments or motions to intervene in accordance with Ohio Administrative Code Rule 4906-2-12 with the Board up to ten (10) days following the publication of this notice.
