I have lived in Seneca County my entire life and my husband's family has lived in the rural area of Seneca County, where the proposed Republic Wind Farm is located, since the 1830's, the era of Andrew Jackson. I can't imagine living in the 1800's with kerosene lamps and no running water. Our ancestors were innovative and persevered to make our area progressive and competitive. I imagine that in the 1930's when fewer than 10% of rural homes had electricity and that when those electric poles started bringing in power, most folks were probably thrilled, while a few were probably appalled at the sight of the wooden poles.
