- {¶ 1} Pursuant to R.C. 4905.26, the Commission has authority to consider written complaints filed against a public utility by any person or corporation regarding any rate, service, regulation, or practice relating to any service furnished by the public utility that is in any respect unjust, unreasonable, insufficient, or unjustly discriminatory.
- $\{\P\ 2\}$ Respondent, Ohio Edison Company (Ohio Edison or Company), is a public utility as defined in R.C. 4905.02 and, as such, is subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.
- {¶ 3} On July 26, 2018, Brian and Amy Menhorn (Complainants) filed this complaint against Ohio Edison. In the complaint, Complainants allege that excessive voltage from Ohio Edison's transformer damaged property in their home. Complainants request that Ohio Edison be held liable and reimburse them for the damage.
- {¶ 4} Ohio Edison filed its answer on August 14, 2018. In its answer, Ohio Edison admits some and denies other allegations in the complaint. In addition, Ohio Edison sets forth in the answer several affirmative defenses.
- $\{\P 5\}$ At this time, the attorney examiner finds that this matter should be scheduled for a settlement conference. The purpose of the settlement conference will be to explore the

parties' willingness to negotiate a resolution of this complaint in lieu of an evidentiary hearing. In accordance with Ohio Adm.Code 4901-1-26, any statement made in an attempt to settle this matter without the need for an evidentiary hearing will not generally be admissible to prove liability or invalidity of a claim. An attorney examiner from the Commission's legal department will facilitate the settlement process. However, nothing prohibits either party from initiating settlement negotiations prior to the scheduled settlement conference.

- {¶ 6} Accordingly, a settlement conference shall be scheduled for September 25, 2018, at 1:30 p.m. at the offices of the Commission, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215. Visitors should register at the lobby desk and then proceed to the 11th floor in order to participate in the settlement conference. If a settlement is not reached at the conference, the attorney examiner may conduct a discussion of procedural issues. Procedural issues for discussion may include discovery dates, possible stipulations of facts, and potential hearing dates.
- {¶ 7} Pursuant to Ohio Adm.Code 4901-1-26(F), the representatives of the public utility shall investigate the issues raised in the complaint prior to the settlement conference, and all parties attending the conference shall be prepared to discuss settlement of the issues raised and shall have the requisite authority to settle those issues. In addition, parties attending the settlement conference should bring with them all documents relevant to this matter.
- $\{\P 8\}$ As is the case in all Commission complaint proceedings, the complainants have the burden of proving the allegations of the complaint. Grossman v. Public. Util. Comm., 5 Ohio St. 2d 189, 214 N.E. 2d 666 (1966).
 - $\{\P 9\}$ It is, therefore,
