We built the home 14 years ago with the lines already on our property. We had the home built on the location of our 10 acres around the poles and "wet spots" with plans of building a large garage and a gazebo and locations already in mind. They have not happened yet due to health issues. The existing power lines are as close to our home as they could possibly go. Any further to the other side of the existing lines and they will be in our "wet spots". My husband has spent countless hours tiling drainage ditches spider webbed through out the property to redirect the water. AEP was given the tile maps. We have a 1200 foot graveled driveway. We have had gravel delivered by very large trucks before. I am concerned that relocation of the lines will inhibit that delivery. One of my complaints is , I was told at one of the meetings that one of the many reasons the line was being moved was for the looks and safety of the homes near the lines. I have the nicest, newest and most expensive home on the line of the path and I don't like to think that my beautiful home will have a line and pole in my front yard. I don't count? I am not opposed to the lines or poles. Like I said I built the home knowing the line were there. I do appreciate the electric company and the increase of power that they are providing us with the new lines. I just think there are better options than my front yard. I understand that as of right now ,my property is a second option for the lines and hopefully you do not reset poles in my yard. When the new poles are set and lines taken down, I do not want gravel down in my yard to take poles down. We have spent too much time picking up rocks to turn this ten acres from a corn field into a yard. I would also like for AEP to relinquish their rights to my property from the existing lines.
