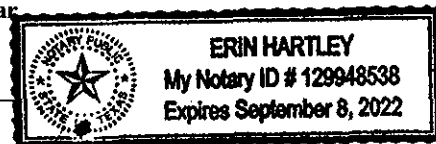

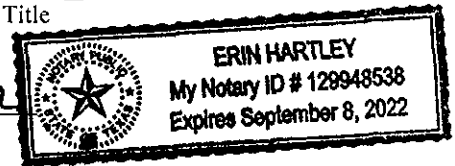

TPS assists independent power producers, municipal and cooperative utilities, large industrial customers and competitive retailers in meeting load obligations and optimizing resource value by performing a broad range of power marketing services, including trading congestion revenue rights, Renewable Energy Certificates and emission allowances. TPS coordinates purchase and sale of electric capacity, energy and ancillary services, as well as energy risk management and financial and physical hedging, for its third-party clients, both renewable (wind, solar and landfill gas) and fossil fueled. TPS also offers scheduling, bidding and market interface and operations, including customized accounting, settlement, invoicing and reporting services and round-the-clock trading operations.

Under the service contract between TPM and Tenaska, Tenaska will provide services to TPM using some of the same expert staff that have served TPS under Tenaska's services contract with TPS. TEI also may have affiliates which own or are involved in multiple lines of non-regulated business, such as oil and gas production, drilling operations and biofuels production, as well as affiliates that operate natural gas marketing and storage companies. This list does not include any non-regulated companies or companies that are not electric energy companies.

Tenaska provides similar services to Tenaska Power Services Co. (TPS). TPS is a leading nationwide power marketing firm, engaged in the physical and financial trading of wholesale power throughout the United States and in Canada. It is certified to provide scheduling, settlement and market interface services in ERCOT, MISO, PJM, NYISO, SPP, CAISO and ISO-NE. TPS assists independent power producers, municipal and cooperative utilities, large industrial customers and competitive retailers in meeting load obligations and optimizing resource value by performing a broad range of power marketing services, including trading congestion revenue rights, Renewable Energy Certificates and emission allowances. TPS coordinates purchase and sale of electric capacity, energy and ancillary services, as well as energy risk management and financial and physical hedging, for its third-party clients, both renewable (wind, solar and landfill gas) and fossil fueled. TPS also offers scheduling, bidding and market interface and operations, including customized accounting, settlement, invoicing and reporting services and round-the-clock trading operations.

Under the service contract between TPM and Tenaska, Tenaska will provide services to TPM using some of the same expert staff that have served TPS under Tenaska's services contract with TPS. Because of the positive results that this group of experts have obtained for TPS under the TPS-Tenaska services contract, TPM is confident that this group of skilled professionals will be able to perform services for Applicant at the same high level of competence as they have demonstrated in their services to TPS.

Tenaska Power Management, LLC (“TPM”) has contracted with Tenaska, Inc. (“Tenaska”) to provide market support, interface with the ISO, as well as settlement, contracts, accounting and computer services. The following key TPM personnel will provide services in their designated areas of responsibility, will supervise personnel reporting to them in their respective areas to ensure provision of services, and will be responsible for managing the contract relationship with Tenaska for their respective functions to coordinate the provision of services.

Curry Aldridge

Curry Aldridge is the Vice President of Origination and Commercial Operations of TPM. Curry, based in Texas, is responsible for managing Tenaska’s origination team as well as several of the back office operations of the business. These back office duties include managing the settlements, process integrity, contracts, and strategic technology departments. Curry was promoted into this position at Tenaska in February 2013.
