LE Energy is a privately held, Retail Energy Provider headquartered in Opelika, Alabama and was founded in 2013 by Mr. Hare and Mr. Cato. LE Energy began doing business as Michigan Natural Gas as a licensed Alternative Gas Supplier in the State of Michigan. In 2015, LE Energy began doing business as Utility Gas and Power in Illinois, as a licensed Alternative Gas Supplier. In 2017, Utility Gas and Power began serving both natural gas and electric customers in Ohio as a Competitive Retail Electric Supplier and a Competitive Retail Natural Gas Supplier.

LE Energy is currently conducting business as an Alternative Gas Supplier in the State of Michigan doing business as Michigan Natural Gas, as an Alternative Gas Supplier in the State of Illinois doing business as Utility Gas and Power, and as a Competitive Retail Natural Gas Supplier in the State of Ohio doing business as Utility Gas and Power.

Exhibit B-2 "Experience and Plans"

The two principles of Utility Gas and Power are Cliff Hare and Philip Cato.

Cliff Hare:

Mr. Hare has been in the energy industry since 1978. Mr. Hare worked for Southern Natural Gas (now a subsidiary of Kinder Morgan) from 1978 until 1987. While at Southern Natural, Hare served as a pipeline engineer and also as Chief Engineer and Assistant to the President of South Georgia Natural Gas, a subsidiary of Southern Natural. Subsequently, Hare worked for Dynegy Marketing and Trade from 1987 until 2003. During his 16 years at Dynegy, Hare served in

various sales, marketing and trading capacities, the last of which was President of Marketing, North America. During, this period, Hare had more than 14 years of gas sales experience. In 2003, Hare co-founded Eagle Energy, where he was President and Chief Operating Officer. Eagle Energy marketed approximately 4 Bcf per day of natural gas and 2,000 MW of power across the US and Canada. As President and COO of Eagle for 5 years, Hare managed all of the enterprise financial and administrative duties of the company, including profit and loss responsibilities. In 2013, Hare co-founded LE Energy, a retail energy company, currently operating as Michigan Natural Gas in the State of Michigan and Utility Gas and Power in Illinois and Ohio. Hare serves as Chairman and CEO of LE Energy.

Philip Cato:

Mr. Cato began his career with Eagle Energy in 2004, performing various transportation and marketing activities, including his role as Manager of Midwest Trading. When Eagle was sold, Cato moved to work for EDF Trading North America in the same role. He subsequently took a position with Twin Eagle Resource Management to manage the Midwest and Western Region Marketing and Trading responsibilities. In 2013, Cato became co-founder and President and COO of LE Energy, where he oversees the day to day operations of the retail energy business. Cato has been in the energy business since 2004 and has extensive experience in the energy markets.

Applicant seeks to renew certification to provide natural gas and electric services to residential and small commercial customers within the service territories of various Ohio Utilities. Applicant currently offers variable and fixed price offerings to such customers and adheres to the requirements set forth by the Commission rules adopted pursuant to Section 4929.22 of the Revised Code and contained in Chapter 4901:1-29 of the Ohio Administrative Code. Customer inquiries and complaints are addressed as they are received by the customer service, quality control, and compliance teams.

Since 2013, applicant has provided natural gas service to residential and commercial customers in the State of Michigan through the four main natural gas utilities in the state- DTE, Consumers Energy, SEMCO, and Michigan Gas Utilities. Applicant contracts with wholesale suppliers to purchase natural gas supplies. Applicant has natural gas delivered directly to the city-gate for retail customers' delivery requirements. Applicant nominates and schedules natural gas to retail customers on multiple utility Electronic Bulletin Boards. Applicant manages all customer service responsibilities including inbound and outbound calls, as well as account management, quality control, and compliance.


