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    Numerous other parties have intervened. I do
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     not see any counsel, but I will open the floor.
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     Seeing none, we will move on.
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                 The subject of today's public
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    hearing is Vectren Energy Delivered of Ohio,
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     Inc.'s application to increase it's natural gas
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distribution rates, which has been consolidated with two separate applications to implement an alternative rate plan.

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Vectren filed its application to increase rates on March 30th, 2018. Vectren is requesting to increase its distribution rates by \$30 million. The Staff filed its Report and Recommendation on October 1st, 2018. In its report the Staff recommends lowering the increase to a range between 12 and \$16 million.

Staff's report is a recommendation only and the final decision will ultimately be made by the Commission.

The local public hearing scheduled in this matter is only one aspect of the process. In addition to this evening public hearings were held in Dayton on November 15th and one was held in Washington Court House this past Monday.

An evidentiary hearing is currently scheduled to occur in the Commission's offices in Columbus on December 4th, 2018.

The purpose of tonight is to receive comments from the public regarding Vectren's applications. This evening is not a question

and answer session. All the representatives from the Company, Ohio Consumers' Counsel and Staff may be able to speak to any concerns after the hearing ends.

Tonight's hearing is being transcribed by a court reporter and any testimony given will be incorporated into the official record of the case and it will be reviewed and considered by the Commission in making their final decision on the application.

If you do plan to testify please speak clearly so that the court reporter can accurately reflect your comments on the record.

In just a minute here I will go to the list of the people who have signed up to testify. Before you give your comments I will ask you to state your name and address, then I will swear you in.

Should you decide you do not want to testify when I call your name you can merely pass to the next witness.

The Commission appreciates your presentation tonight at this hearing. And at this time we will begin.

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## JOHN LAWS

11 called as a witness, being first duly sworn,

12 testified as follows:

MR. LAWS: My name is John Laws.

14 I live at 1000 Norwood Drive, Sidney, Ohio.

15 Life-long resident of Sidney, Ohio.

16 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Thank you, sir.

17 Proceed.

MR. LAWS: Yes. After reading the article in the Dayton Daily News with a \$35 minimum charge, I assumed that's the monthly charge that it is going to be.

I got all my bills out and I looked through them. And that is a pretty hefty increase in a monthly minimum. I realize Vectren has done a good job for the community,

put a lot of new lines in and I give the Company credit. You have done well.

But, my rate, I have stuck with

Vectren all the time. I think through the city
on their bidding process and going with the

City, I stayed with the City of Sidney. I guess
it's because of the volume which helps maybe
adjust the price.

But, I look at this monthly charge. I am looking at one right now. It was \$18.37, the most recent one I paid, the monthly charge.

Now, if that is going to \$35, that is an increase of what, \$16.63. That is a pretty hefty increase.

I realize you have to have somewhere to collect more money to pay your bills, but we as -- I am an 87 year old resident of this community, and we are on fixed incomes, a lot of us are.

And I feel, a just increase I have no problem with, but I feel this is too much of an increase when you put that on a monthly statement. I don't know how many of your other service charges are going to change because there is three or four on each sheet I get

monthly.

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But, if that is the minimum monthly charge, \$35 is a lot more than \$18.36. And I looked on my bills, I think it averages out to about \$28. I did the whole year analysis.

And that being the case, it's still a \$7 increase. So, that is a percentage too, a pretty hefty increased percentage.

That is what I am all about. And willing to let anybody see my bills and welcome to let Vectren or anyone see them. But my complaint is I think it's too much of an increase at one time. Thank you.

(WITNESS SWORN)

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18 MIKE BARHORST

called as a witness, being first duly sworn, testified as follows:

MR. BARHORST: First of all welcome to Sidney. I am Mike Barhorst, Mayor of the City. And the address for City Hall is 201

West Poplar Street, Sidney, Ohio 45365.

I will mirror some of what John has

just said. My concern I think is the 22 percent increase.

I know again I am pleased with what Vectren has done in the community, what they will do in the future. I know their top leadership and I trust them.

My concern is for those who are on fixed incomes, those who have or are at the margins of society who I know struggle to pay the current bills. And a 22 percent increase is one that is going to really hurt some of them tremendously.

I don't know how you accomplish what you need to accomplish and what Vectren needs to accomplish without the funds that you need, but I would hope there would be something less than that that we can settle on that would not be such a tremendous increase at one time.

I don't know if there is a way to do it staggered. I suspect knowing the little I know about the Public Utilities Commission that you couldn't do 5 percent this year and 5 percent next year and 5 percent the next year.

But, I think if there was some way to do that it could certainly ease it in for

folks.

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I don't see most pensions increasing at all. I know some widows who are on pensions that are less than a couple thousand dollars a month.

And, again, while \$7.16 isn't going to bother me, it will certainly bother others who are on fixed incomes.

So, that is my statement.

ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Thank you.

COMMISSIONER FRIEDEMAN: Thank you.
