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ALJ FULLIN: The Ohio Power Siting Board has scheduled for hearing at this time and place Case No. 18-279-EL-BTX which is the Glencoe-Speidel 138 kV Transmission Line Project. My name is Daniel Fullin. I am the Administrative Law Judge assigned to the case.

And we'll begin today's hearing by noting appearances from both sides starting with the Company.

MR. WOLFFRAM: Thank you, your Honor.

For AEP Ohio Transmission Company, Inc., Tanner S.

Wolffram and Christen M. Blend. Our address is One
Riverside Plaza, Columbus, Ohio, 29th Floor, 43215.

Also with the company today is Ronald M. Howard, Jr.,
he is the witness sponsoring the Stipulation and
Recommendation in this case, and Jacqueline M. Rich
who is observing the hearing this morning.

ALJ FULLIN: Okay. Thank you. And could you give me your last name again.

MR. WOLFFRAM: It's Wolffram,

W-O-L-F-F-R-A-M.

25 ALJ FULLIN: Okay. Thank you.

MR. WOLFFRAM: Thank you.

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ALJ FULLIN: Thank you. And appearance on behalf of the Staff.

MR. MARGARD: Thank you, your Honor. On behalf of the Staff of the Power Siting Board, Mike DeWine, Ohio Attorney General, William Wright, Section Chief of the Public Utilities Section, by Assistant Attorney General Werner L. Margard, 30 East Broad Street, 16th Floor, Columbus, Ohio.

ALJ FULLIN: Okay. Thank you. And before we proceed does anyone have anything in terms of preliminary remarks or something besides just going on the record and putting on the testimony?

One reason I am asking I understand there is a member of the public that wants to put something on the record. So how would we want to go about doing that? Is there any objection to that?

MR. MARGARD: No objection, your Honor, and I think perhaps just to help our public member to be a little more at ease we might proceed, have the company go forward, or Staff present the Staff Report and have the Company present their witnesses.

ALJ FULLIN: Then bring him in.

MR. MARGARD: Then afford him an opportunity to speak.

ALJ FULLIN: Okay. If that's the case, then if there aren't any other preliminary matters, I will let the company go forward with the presentation of their case.

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MR. WOLFFRAM: Thank you, your Honor.

Before we call Ron M. Howard, Jr., who is the witness sponsoring the Stipulation and Recommendation in this case, I would like to mark certain exhibits before moving forward, if we could. The binder is in front of you on the Bench.

AEP Ohio Transco Exhibit No. 1 is the pre-application notification letter filed on February 22, 2018. AEP Ohio Transco Exhibit No. 2 is proofs of notification and publication filed March 9 and 12, 2018. AEP Ohio Transco Exhibit No. 3 is the Application filed June 13, 2018, as supplemented on June 15 and July 20, 2018, and certified as completed by the Board Staff on August 13. AEP Ohio Transco Exhibit No. 4 is the Notice of Compliance filed on September 19, 2018. AEP Ohio Transco Exhibit No. 5 is Proof of Notification and Publication filed on November 15, 2018. AEP Ohio Transco Exhibit No. 6 is the Direct Testimony of Ronald M. Howard, Jr. And Joint Exhibit No. 1 is the Stipulation and Recommendation.

- Q. And do you have before you what's been marked as Staff Exhibit No. 1?
- 16 A. I do.
- Q. And can you identify that document for me, please.
- A. That is the Staff Report of Investigation filed in this docket on November 14, 2018.
- Q. And have you reviewed that document prior to your testimony today?
- A. I have.
- Q. And do you have any corrections, changes, or modifications to that document?

A. I do not.

- Q. You also indicate in your testimony that you also support what's been marked as Joint Exhibit No. 1, the Joint Stipulation in this case; is that correct?
 - A. That is correct.
- Q. And have you had an opportunity to review the testimony of Company Witness Ronald Howard in this proceeding?
 - A. I have.
- Q. And do you agree with his explanations of why the Stipulation meets the Commission's traditional three-part test for the approval of stipulations?
 - A. I do agree.
- Q. Finally, Mr. Pawley, you indicate in your testimony that you reserve the right to supplement your prefiled testimony. Is there any need to do so at this time?

- MR. MARGARD: I have no further questions and tender the witness for cross-examination, your Honor.

15 1 MR. WOLFFRAM: No, your Honor. 2 ALJ FULLIN: All right. Thank you. 3 have no questions either. Thank you for your testimony. 4 5 MR. MARGARD: Your Honor, I would move 6 the admission of Staff Exhibits 1 and 2. 7 ALJ FULLIN: If there's no objection, I'll admit them into the record at this time. 8 9 MR. WOLFFRAM: No objection, your Honor. 10 (EXHIBITS ADMITTED INTO EVIDENCE.) 11 MR. You can remain 4 where you are. 5 6 WILSON SECREST MITCHELL 7 being first duly sworn, as prescribed by law, was examined and testified as follows: 8 9 DIRECT EXAMINATION 10 ALJ FULLIN: And, again, if you would 11 begin by identifying yourself for the record. 12 THE WITNESS: Wilson Secrest Mitchell. 13 Do you need it spelled? S-E-C-R-E-S-T. I live in Arlington, and I own property in Belmont County which 14 is on the right-of-way that's being discussed. 15 16 ALJ FULLIN: Okay. So you live in Upper 17 Arlington, Ohio, but you have property in the area that's affected. 18 19 THE WITNESS: Yes. 20 ALJ FULLIN: Okay. 2.1 THE WITNESS: The project description in 22 the document you guys described in the second 23 paragraph, project description talks about that a 24 50-feet right-of-way adjacent to the residence would 25 be included. I don't have any residences that are

involved with this on my property in Belmont County, but I do have a lot of wood tree lots. The wood tree lots were started to plant in the 1950s, and they recognize the existing right-of-way which is 50 feet and have not had any problems in all these years that I'm aware of on that line.

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The expansion of this line will affect a lot of these wood lots, increased expense. We have wood lots that have been -- are 50 years old, and I go in and we thin the trees. We clean the area up. We've marketed and sold trees in the past out of this area, not in the right-of-way, in our own area, and would like to be able to continue doing that.

no more than 10 feet tall. They'll be growing, but they are out of the right-of-way. If we expand the right-of-way -- so since the 50 foot is allowed in Bethesda and new poles are higher and I think that I could be -- I would like to see that statement project description changed to reflect that the engineer could actually look at seeing does that make sense along my property line. There's two properties involved, two parcels involved.

That's about it, you know, the white pine which is the -- one of the large wood lots is -- the

trees are mature. They are growing thicker. They've represented no danger to any of the lines. We've had oak trees going down through it. Instead of putting the big 100 foot I am just saying on this property to be able to maintain my business and my recreational, I would like to be able to see that just go back to the 50 line as it is.

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ALJ FULLIN: All right. You said there's two properties so there's two wooded lots is what we are talking about?

THE WITNESS: There's two parcels that are directly involved with this plan. One is called Buckeye Bow Acres. I am a 50 percent of that one and speak for it, and the one that's called the Mitchell property, I own it. The trees -- the number of lots involved vary by age. Like the one, the pine trees I was just talking about, those are actually planted in the late 1950s. There's another lot that's been planted in 1950s that's further down. There's two lots of oak trees that we planted and some fruit trees and stuff on the other end.

So there's a series of lots. I would think there is about six or seven types of lots going down there. Nothing is in the right-of-way. Yeah, nothing is the right-of-way.

ALJ FULLIN: Nothing is in the existing right-of-way?

THE WITNESS: Existing right-of-way.

ALJ FULLIN: Is some in what would be the

proposed right-of-way?

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would go in and start taking out trees in areas that we've taken -- probably take out some of the existing large trees. There's some natural woods that are along the pathway that we've thinned but aren't really maintaining. The pine trees we really maintain that as a going in. We would like to be able to do the others. We bought that property a couple years ago, several years ago.

ALJ FULLIN: So --

THE WITNESS: All I'm saying is if 50 foot would run through Bethesda, 50 foot run through the existing right-of-way today, I'm just saying for the project description I would like to be able to have my property looked at as a possibility of maintaining the existing right-of-way.

ALJ FULLIN: Yeah. So what you're asking or suggesting or would like to see is that as it affects the properties that you're describing that you have all or partial ownership in, you would like

to see the existing 50 feet right-of-way remain as the only right-of-way and not be expanded 100 feet --

4 ALJ FULLIN: -- as it affects your

THE WITNESS: Exactly.

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THE WITNESS: Right.

ALJ FULLIN: All right. I will allow additional questioning I guess first by Staff if they have any questions.

MR. MARGARD: I have no questions for the witness. Thank you, your Honor.

ALJ FULLIN: If the Company would like in any way to address what's been testified to here including any questions that you have or any statements that you would like to make in reference to it, I would like to give you the floor to do so.

MR. WOLFFRAM: Thank you, your Honor. We just have a couple follow-up questions just to clarify.

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CROSS-EXAMINATION

22 By Mr. Wolffram:

Q. You are not opposing the actual construction of the line. You just want the property to be looked at.

- A. No, no. We have a line there today, and it causes us no problem.
- Q. So you are just concerned about the actual width of the right-of-way.

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A. That's right, because it will take my wood lots out.

MR. WOLFFRAM: Thank you. That's the only questions we have, your Honor. Thank you.

when we go to address this on -- in the order, is it pretty clear to all the parties? Explain it to me where these lots are and what part of the project description we're talking about if we need to modify that in any way. And if so, would there be a proposal to do that in the way that's being suggested? We could go off the record and have a discussion, if you would like.

MS. BLEND: I think that would be helpful, your Honor.

ALJ FULLIN: Whatever we decide to talk about it. Let's do that. Let's go off the record.

(Discussion off the record.)

ALJ FULLIN: Back on the record.

MS. BLEND: Thank you, your Honor. To reflect the discussion that the Company and counsel

for Staff and Staff just had off the record with Mr. Mitchell, with respect to Mr. Mitchell's concern or suggestion that the Company evaluate whether a 50-foot right-of-way is feasible and appropriate on the parcels that he owns or has an interest in that are on this project, the Company agrees to commit to work with Mr. Mitchell to evaluate whether the Company can take a narrower than 100-foot right-of-way on his parcels, and the Company also agrees to work with Mr. Mitchell and is happy to do so to evaluate the -- an old schoolhouse structure that Mr. Mitchell identified may be or is in the plan right-of-way of the line.

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ALJ FULLIN: Okay. Did you have anything to add to what she's described that you want to make sure was on the record? Were you satisfied with what she's described.

THE WITNESS: I'm satisfied.

ALJ FULLIN: Okay. Thank you very much for that description of what happened off the record and we'll -- I think at this point then I don't remember if the Staff still has the floor. Did you rest?

MR. MARGARD: If I had not, I do so now.

ALJ FULLIN: Okay. So I think both

parties have rested. Is there anything else that needs to come before the Board's attention before I bring this hearing to a close?

Seeing no hands raised or anything, we'll bring this hearing to a close. Thank you, everyone.
