

The Project will retrofit an existing pipeline to allow inspection by modern in-line inspection tools (ILITs). The Project would replace approximately 8,500 feet of 16" natural gas pipeline with 20" pipeline. The project corridor extends from the existing Memorial Station on WPAFB to Wrightway Road, along the north side of State Route 4.
