### ENTRY

{¶ 1} Duke Energy Ohio, Inc. (Duke) is an electric distribution utility (EDU) as defined by R.C. 4928.01(A)(6) and a public utility as defined in R.C. 4905.02, and, as such, is subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.

{¶ 2} On December 19, 2018, the Commission approved a stipulation filed by various parties, which provided for Duke to implement a rider for recovery of vegetation management services (Rider ESRR). *In the Matter of the Application of Duke Energy Ohio, Inc., for an Increase in Electric Distribution Rates*, Case Nos. 17-32-El-AIR, *et al.*, Opinion and Order (Dec. 19, 2018.)

{¶ 3} On January 29, 2019, Duke filed its application requesting approval to adjust the rate for Rider ESRR. In order to facilitate a thorough review of Duke's application, the attorney examiner finds that the following procedural schedule should be established:

- (a) Motions to intervene shall be filed by May 13, 2019
- (b) Comments shall be filed by May 13, 2019
- (c) Reply comments shall be filed by May 28, 2019

{¶ 4} It is, therefore,

{¶ 5} ORDERED, That the procedural schedule set forth in Paragraph 3 be adopted. It is further,

{¶ 6} ORDERED, That a copy of this Entry be served upon all parties of record.
