The Mayor of the Village of Middle Point received the May 28, 2019 Entry for the above Case in early June.

The Village of Middle Point Council was presented this information and has concerns regarding of the downgrading of the Main Street Railroad crossing. The other two crossings in the village have safety arms that lower and block the intersection. The Main Street crossing only has the audible signal to warn of an oncoming train.

The Village Council is refuting that this crossing has a "minimal car count per day". This is a main crossing especially for those who live on the east side of the village. Also, during the school year, buses use this crossing.

The crossing has properties on both sides of the street that have foliage and structures near the tracks that blocks a clear view of the tracks. The Council is concerned that without an audible signal that there will be a heightened safety risk.

The Village of Middle Point Council is requesting that PUCO deny the request for downgrading the railroad crossing at Main Street and have the audible bell signal remain at that intersection.

It has been brought to my attention that the railroad company that operates the railroad line that runs through the Village of Middle Point, Ohio is requesting to remove all signaling devices at the crossing of Main St. inside the village.

While this may not be the most heavily traveled crossing in town, it is DEFINITELY the most hazardous due to the placement of houses and foliage in that location. With the increase of crude oil train traffic, I feel removing the signaling the devices is an accident waiting to happen, especially since the residents who travel that route have grown accustom to the warning system.

Please consider mandating a warning device at this location. It is very important and worth every penny spent to save a life.

Dear Mayor Dickman:

It was brought to my attention that the Public Utilities Commission (PUCO) is considering removing the bells at Main Street (532757C) railroad crossing in VanWert, County Ohio. Upon checking the State and Federal Railroad Administration's (FRA) websites, I found CSX as the crossing owner and that the only active warning device at this crossing is bells. According to the U.S. Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration, Railroad-Highway Grade Crossing Handbook, August 2007, bells are considered an active control device. Pictures on the PUCO's website show various sight obstructions in all four quadrants, including permanent structures that include homes and other buildings. It is unclear if the railroad has removed vegetation on their right-of-way according to ORC4955.36. The crossing is only marked with a crossbuck sign which by standards is considered minimal.

The vehicle traffic count is low, but school buses use this crossing on a daily basis. It should be noted the FRA's website shows ZERO school bus count.

Because this crossing is not protected with gates and has sight obstructions preventing a driver from being able to see down the tracks for an oncoming train in all four quadrants, the bells might be the only advance warning of an oncoming train. If you take away the audible sounding of the bell, the only option for a motorist or a school bus driver would be to look down the tracks. And as mentioned, the crossing has sight obstructions which include permanent structures.

It is the Angels on Track Foundation's opinion that taking the bells away would create a dangerous hazard for any motorist or school bus driver. The only possible reason for removing the bells would be eliminating responsibility for the railroad to ensure their equipment is working properly. The safety of the public and school students would surely be put in jeopardy. The best option for the crossing would be gates, as school bus traffic is part of the federal criteria for selection.

In our opinion, there is no logical reason to take away any form of active advance warning of an oncoming train at a railroad crossing.
