Long Ridge Energy Generation LLC (“Long Ridge”) is planning to construct a new 12-inch steel natural gas pipeline in Monroe County.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Long Ridge is planning to construct an approximately 9,963 foot, 12-inch natural gas pipeline to deliver gas from an existing natural gas gathering system in Monroe County, OH, to its natural gas fired electric generation plant located on State Route 7 north of Hannibal, OH. 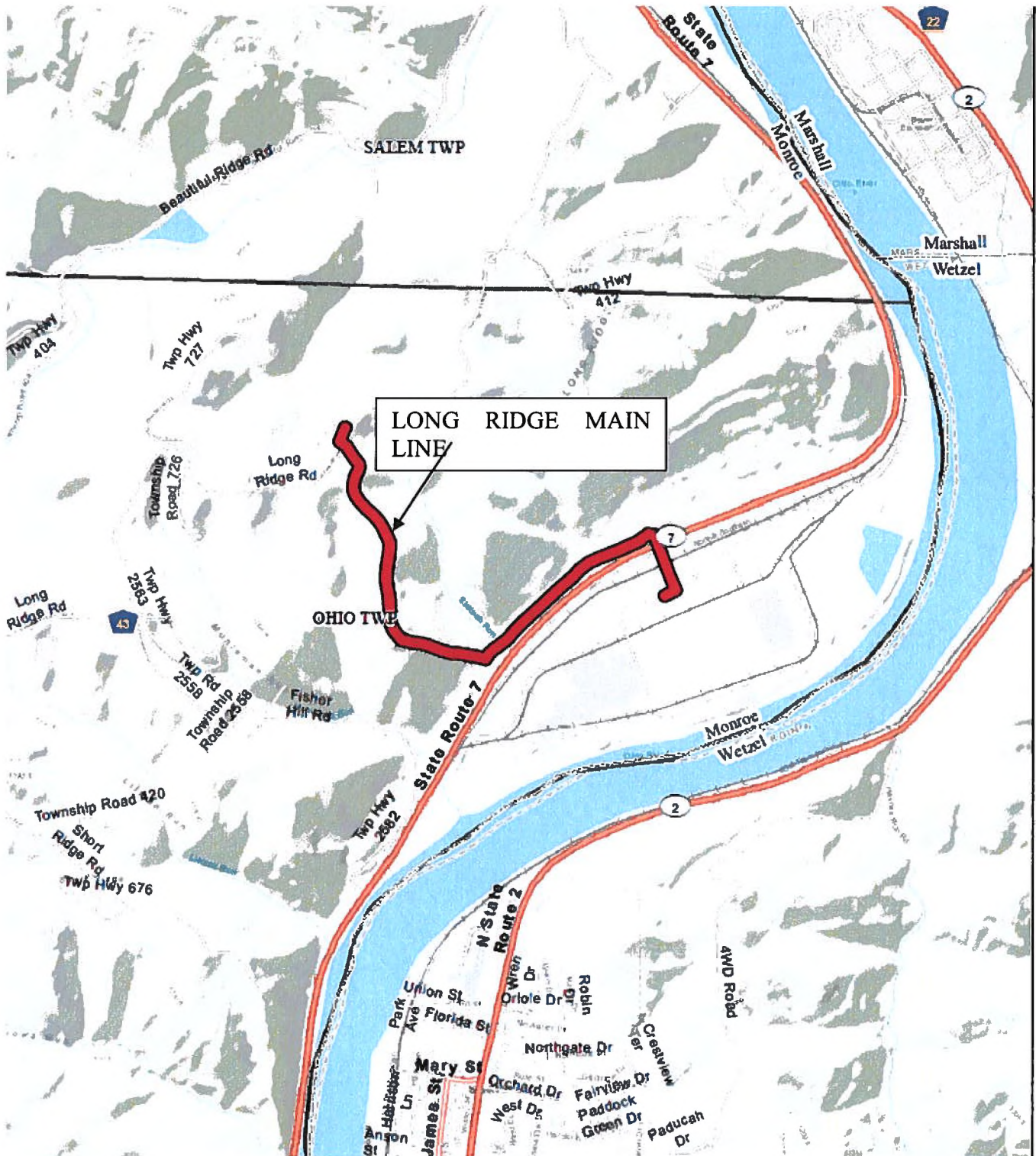

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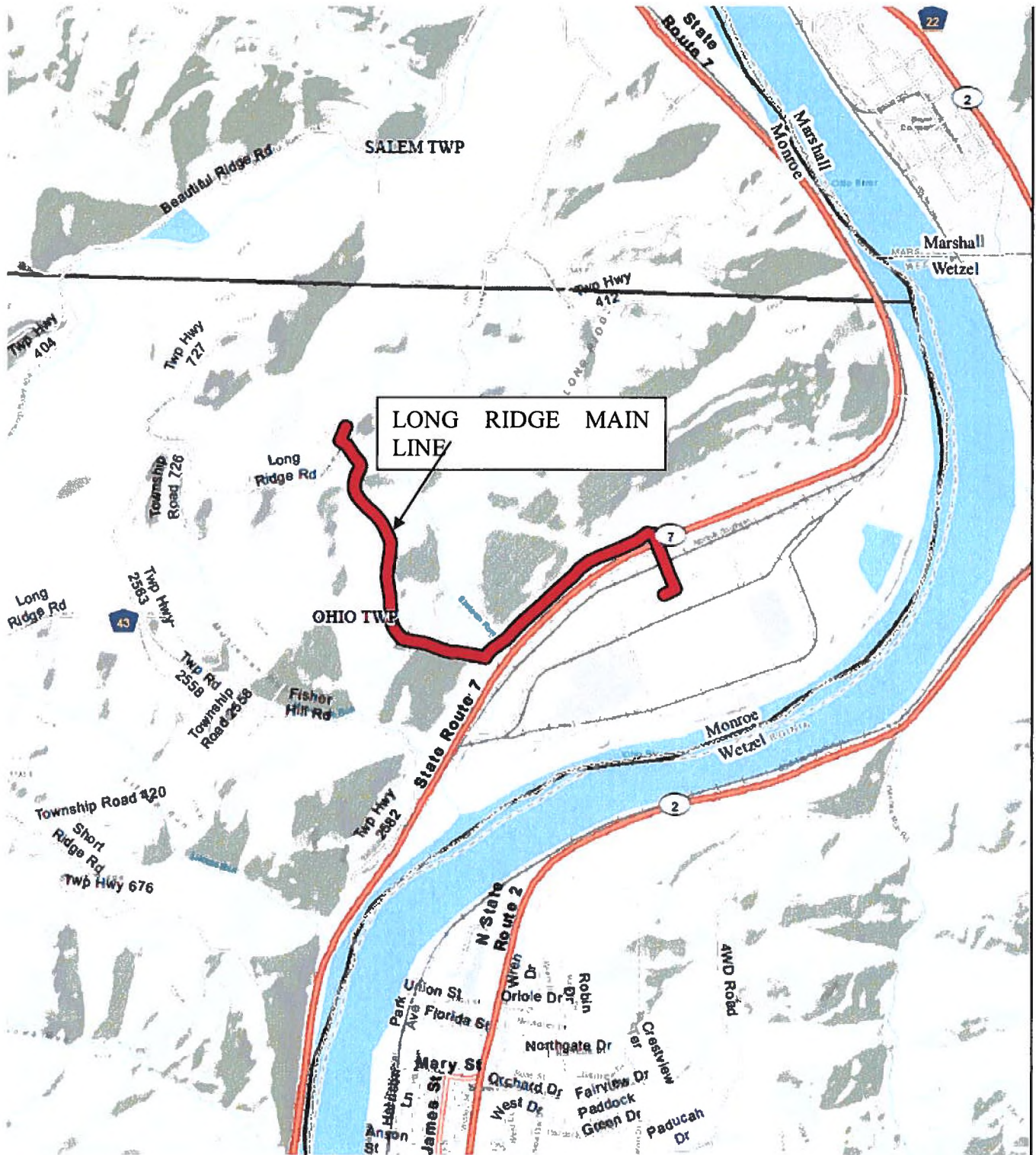
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LONG RIDGE MAIN LINE

"There's not much time to think. That's what's good about this project," Anslow said as he told the students to focus on the main features of eyes, nose, cheekbones and chin.

Jarred Small, arts learning coordinator for the Ohio Arts Council, visited with Anslow as the students worked against the clock.

"They (the students) just have to work fast, not

ODOT celebrates opening of new facility

Jim Wells spent most of his time as Monroe County's ODOT transportation manager battling with an aging building.

A lack of space made things difficult, but his crew got by.

Sometimes they'd have meetings, and some of his guys would be in the hallway.

But they don't have to worry about that anymore.

Wells and the rest of the Monroe County ODOT workers moved into their

new 30,319 square-foot facility in October.

A ribbon-cutting was held Tuesday, Nov. 19, at the new facility on State Route 26 just past the Monroe County Fairgrounds.

Wells said his first impression of the facility

was to think it was "outstanding."

"We have everything," Wells said. "The mechanics have working bays. There is enough storage for all the equipment. There are offices to hold

Board continues to invest in Swiss Hills

The Switzerland of Ohio Local School District Board of Education continues to invest in the Swiss Hills Career Center.

The board approved \$325,000 in revisions and additions to the facility's Innovation Lab project during its regular meeting Thursday, Nov. 14.

The latest investment is part of a continued effort by the district to upgrade the career center.

Part of the \$325,000 investment will be used to update aging classrooms at the facility. Two classrooms will have movable glass partitions, allowing the rooms to be extended by moving the partitions.

When completed, the innovation lab will provide students the opportunity to get the necessary education to learn what the district perceives to be the jobs of the future, such as chemical operators.

They will learn to use high-tech equipment such as a CNC machine while learning skills such as robotics and modeling

and design.

In addition, the programs will provide adult education opportunities once the lab is completed.

The programs will provide more opportunities for local students, but they come at a cost.

In April, the board approved nearly \$700,000 for the construction of a lab as well as equipment.

Another \$2 million was

approved for animal science labs throughout the district.

While the price is steep, district officials felt it was an investment into the future of the district and its students.

"You have to think about what you're gaining because of these programs," Associate Superintendent Cyndi Brill said. "You're training the

workforce, so they (the industry jobs) will come here."

The latest request was met by some hesitation from some board members.

Board member Jerry Gust shared his concern about the amount of money spent relative to the number of new students
