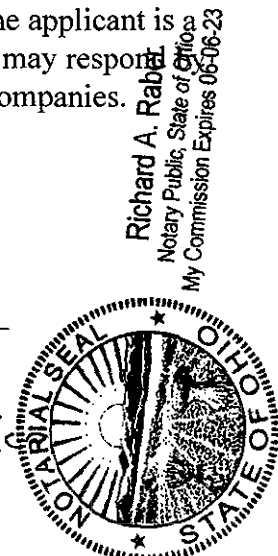



Exhibit B-2 "Experience & Plans"

As founder and CEO of TMGES, Inc., we have now been in business for 8 years and our organization has grown into a few more markets. We expanded into CT, NJ, MD, PA, NY, and TX. With our foundation between IL and OH, TMGES, Inc., is hedging energy budgets for nearly 600 commercial clients. Continuing our focus in the hospitality sector, we successfully manage 250+ hotels between these markets. Our strategies haven't changed much in setting up buying groups and aggregating when we can.

Between 2018, and 2019, our hospitality book grew in Ohio and we began extending our reach in the FES, DPL, and DUKE utilities. We've found a lot of success building small hospitality aggregations between each utility. The last two years, the market has been favorable for renewals and our existing clients expanding their hospitality portfolios, so internal organic growth is taking place every quarter. Even at present day, some of the low prices we are seeing is keeping everyone busy, and it seems risk appetites are beginning to tighten and lean towards long-term stability vs. short-term products.

Our organization grew. We hired a full-time Operations Architect, Drew Pickering, and an Operations Manager, Abby Magtulis who have been helping us tremendously with all the work flow. Pickering has been helping us build a database enabling us to scale with a more technological approach. Magtulis has been a tremendous help in day-to-day operations between our clients and suppliers.

In an effort to respond to customer inquiries and complaints, we do resolve the issue in a timely manner that's in accordance with Commission rules adopted pursuant to Section 4928.10 of the revised code. Whether it be contract enrollment, account drops, extremely rare contract rescission, contract rejection, counter-signed agreement delivery, assignments, termination and assisting in collection of early termination fees, billing inaccuracy, billing accuracy, failed start-dates, change in law occurrences... the list goes on and our operational team has a hands on approach between the client and supplier relationship to answer client inquiries and alleviate client concerns. We leverage all the supplier's resources who have outstanding channel managers that help us stay on top of any inquiries, or irregularities.

As for future plans, we want to continue our growth in the hospitality industry. Our investments with strategic hospitality partners like the Asian American Hotel Owners Association (AAHOA) have helped TMGES, Inc., tell our story, and open up the door for more opportunities, so expanding on this relationship and several others will help us continue to grow our hospitality book. Additionally, we'd like to extend our reach into other industries that have similar multi-unit portfolios. We found some success in the multi-unit restaurant space. 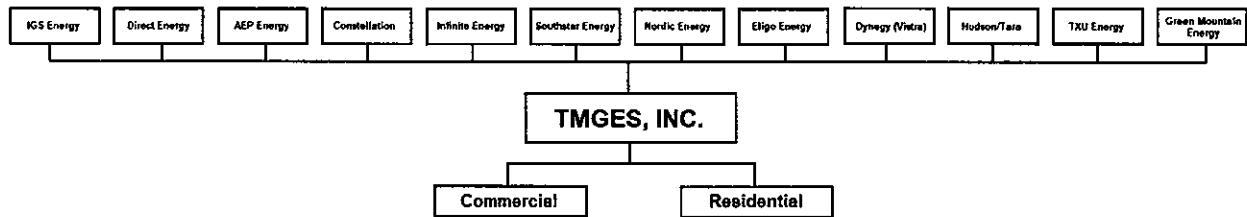
