- {¶ 1} On March 27, 2020, an Entry was issued scheduling a June 18, 2020 hearing for the above-captioned case.
- $\{\P\ 2\}$  Due to circumstances surrounding COVID-19, the hearing will be rescheduled to a date not yet determined.
- {¶ 3} Ohio Adm.Code 4901:2-7-14(E) provides that a respondent who has requested an administrative hearing and fails to participate in the hearing proceeding shall be in default. The rule further states that a respondent in default shall be deemed to have admitted the occurrence of the violation and waived all further right to contest liability to the state for the forfeiture described in the notice.
- $\{\P 4\}$  At the hearing, Staff must prove, by a preponderance of the evidence, that Ace Renchen committed the alleged violation, pursuant to Ohio Adm.Code 4901:2-7-20(A).
- {¶ 5} Following Staff's presentation of evidence at the hearing, it shall be the responsibility of Ace Renchen to present evidence supporting his contentions regarding the alleged violation in this matter.
