EXHIBIT A

INTRODUCTORY NOTE

Frontier North Inc. ("Frontier North"), Frontier Communications of Michigan, Inc. ("Frontier Michigan") and Frontier Communications Online and Long Distance Inc. (collectively, the "Applicants"), pursuant to Ohio Revised Code 4905.402(H) and Ohio Administrative Code 4901:1-6-29(E)(2), hereby provide notice to The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio ("Commission") that Applicants have filed a Petition under Chapter 11 of the United States Bankruptcy Code in the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Southern District of New York (the Restructuring"). Pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code 4901:-6-29(E)(2), Applicants submit this Change in Operations ("CIO") submission due to applications filed with the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC"). Applicants will provide the Commission with a link to the FCC applications once it is available.

PUBLIC INTEREST CONSIDERATIONS

The Restructuring is in the public interest, as it will benefit existing and future Frontier North and Frontier Michigan customers in Ohio and other states. Implementation of the Restructuring plan is expected to reduce Frontier's debt by approximately \$10 billion, thereby providing a long-term solution for Frontier's balance sheet and operations. The Restructuring will better position Frontier and its operating companies, including Frontier North and Frontier Michigan, to compete and provide service in Ohio and to become a more efficient and effective competitor in the dynamic telecommunications marketplace.

¹ On April 15, 2020, the Applicants notified the Commission that, on April 14, 2020, Frontier and certain subsidiaries each filed a petition with the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Southern District of New York ("Bankruptcy Court") to reorganize under Chapter 11 of the United States Bankruptcy Code.

Frontier North and Frontier Michigan will continue to provide regulated voice and other services during and after the Restructuring takes effect. Service will be provided in accordance with tariffs previously filed with the Commission and other commercial contractual arrangement between Frontier North and Frontier Michigan, and its customers. Customer service will not be interrupted, eliminated or increased in price as a result of the Restructuring, and 911, voice telephone and other services will continue to be provided by Frontier North and Frontier Michigan. Implementation of the Restructuring will not adversely affect operations, rates, or services in Ohio.

DESCRIPTION OF THE RESTRUCTURING

On April 14, 2020 (the "Petition Date"), Frontier Communications Corporation ("Frontier" or "Company") and its direct and indirect subsidiaries, including the Applicants, commenced a Chapter 11 bankruptcy proceeding after entering into a Restructuring Support Agreement ("the "RSA") with its senior unsecured noteholders holding more than seventy-five percent of its unsecured bonds (such creditors, the "Consenting Noteholders"). Since the Petition Date, Frontier has worked with the Consenting Noteholders to memorialize the terms set forth in the RSA into a Joint Plan of Reorganization of Frontier Communications Corporation and Its Debtor Affiliates Pursuant to Chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code (the "Plan"). The Plan was filed with the Bankruptcy Court and is expected to be confirmed and approved by the Bankruptcy Court in August 2020.

² "Consenting Noteholders" is defined in the Plan and is comprised of approximately 200 Senior Noteholders who have executed the RSA and have agreed to support the Plan, and that hold over 75% of the Senior Notes through more than 40 different investment funds. The Consenting Noteholders are primarily comprised of large U.S.-based financial investment funds with experience in investing in U.S. telecommunications and technology companies.

The Plan implements the terms of the RSA and provides for a reduction of Frontier's funded debt obligations by over \$10 billion (and thereby reducing its annual interest expense by approximately \$1 billion) by converting all holders of Frontier's senior unsecured notes (the "Senior Noteholders")³ into shareholders of a new, reorganized Frontier parent company ("Reorganized Frontier"). Immediately upon emergence from Chapter 11, the Senior Noteholders will receive and hold the new common stock of Reorganized Frontier, though no single Senior Noteholder is anticipated to hold a 10% or greater interest in Reorganized Frontier.⁴ It is intended that the new common stock of Reorganized Frontier will be publicly traded and listed on a recognized U.S. stock exchange as promptly as reasonably practical after the Company's emergence from Chapter 11. Accordingly, as is the case today, the ownership of Reorganized Frontier will be widely held.

A new corporate structure consisting of Reorganized Frontier and two newly-formed intermediate holding companies (Frontier Communications Intermediate and Frontier Communications Holdings) will replace Frontier Communications Corporation (the current publicly-traded parent holding company) in the ownership structure of Frontier subsidiaries, including the Applicants. No corporate changes will occur as to the Applicants as a result of the Restructuring.

The Plan implements the terms of the RSA and provides for a comprehensive restructuring of Frontier's obligations that preserves the going-concern value of Frontier's business, maximizes Frontier's future financial flexibility, and preserves jobs. Through the

³ The Senior Noteholders hold approximately \$10.95 billion in aggregate principal amount of unsecured senior notes issued by Frontier with maturities between September 2020 and October 2046 ("Senior Notes") which are publicly traded.

Restructuring, all non-funded debt claims against the Company—including all non-funded debt owed to its employees, contractors, vendors, suppliers, carriers, and other third parties—will be paid in full. In so doing, the Restructuring is intended to minimize any potential adverse effects to Frontier's businesses, thus positioning Reorganized Frontier to be successful upon its emergence from bankruptcy.

Further, Frontier will continue to comply with its existing regulatory requirements under Ohio statutes and rules. Frontier North is currently subject to a Complaint, Case No. 19-1582-TP-COC, filed by the Commission Staff, which culminated in a Stipulation between Frontier and Staff filed with the Commission on June 24, 2020. Frontier North will continue to support that proposed Stipulation.
