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Hello, Mary,

This is Jodi Miller.

My internet is, of course, being sketchy.

I would like to have the following testimony read.

Working across from a refinery at a state job in 4020 5th Ave in Columbus for three years (2011-2014), my blood pressure skyrocketed to 180/120. No other health changes occurred. My diet stayed the same. I grew dizzy and nauseated. I walked into a wall at work, causing a traumatic brain injury. Once

I quit that job for a promotion downtown in an inarguably more stressful position, my blood pressure dropped to normal: 110/80.

The only difference?

Moving away from the refinery.

The neighborhood around the refinery is barren, largely devoid of houses. We worked there because the state bought leased uninsulated space as cheaply as possible from Schottentstein's. It was used previously as an airplane hangar.

This is not the case at OSU: it is agricultural, campus, and neighborhood land, all of which will have despoiled water and soil from the proposed plant.

Visiting my sister in law in Carrollton, I was awake all hours with the booms of fracking. The water was undrinkable. The faucets in her house spouted fumes that could be actually lit on fire.

So knowing Ohio State dedicating any part of its physical structure to the horror that is fracking is akin to saying OSU is fine with making water unpotable and health conditions unsafe for students, faculty, and neighbors alike.
