

American Transmission Systems, Incorporated ("ATSI"), a FirstEnergy company, proposes to construct the Highland-GM 138 kV Transmission Line Loop to Magellan Substation Project ("Project"), in a Letter of Notification Application submitted to the Ohio Power Stiing Board" (Poard") for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need.

The Project is located in the Village of Lordstown, Trumbull County, Ohio. ATSI proposes to construct a new 138 kV Magellan Substation which will cover approximately 106,250 square feet. The Project also proposes to construct an approximately 0.5-mile long 138 kV transmission line loop connecting the new Magellan Substation to the Highland-GM 138 kV Transmission Line. The Magellan Substation will serve a new ATSI customer, Ultium Cells LLC, and improve reliability in the area of the Project.
