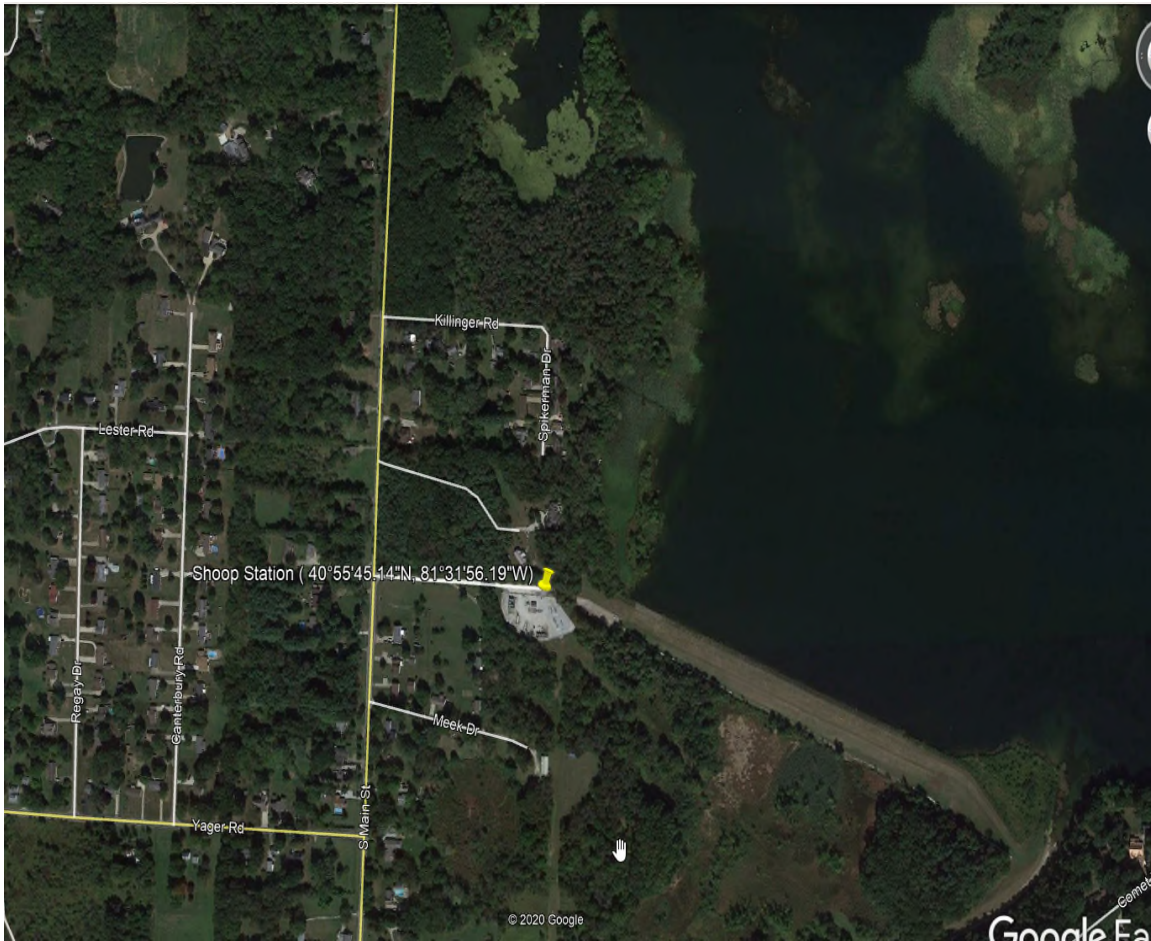
The following information is being provided in compliance with Condition No. 3 of the February 22, 2019 Ohio Power Siting Board (“OPSB”) Staff Report of Investigation, and as agreed to by the East Ohio Gas Company d/b/a Dominion Energy Ohio’s (“DEO”) Supplement to Letter of Notification filed on February 26, 2019.

Condition No. 3 states:

Prior to construction, the Applicant shall submit to Staff, for review and confirmation that it complies with this condition, a project construction plan which includes the specific locations of its laydown areas. If the specific locations chosen appear to have additional adverse impacts, the Applicant shall either propose different specific locations without such impacts, or refile its application.

DEO has selected Titan Energy as its general contractor for the LN2925 Phase 3 Replacement Project – North Section. DEO is providing a laydown area within the existing Shoop Station that the construction contractor will utilize.

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Aerial view of the proposed laydown location for LN2925 Phase 3 Replacement Project within existing DEO Shoop Station is located on Jones Drive. This area poses no environmental issues as the area is an existing grassy field with no environmental features located in the proposed laydown area.

The laydown area is already stoned with additional stone planned to be installed during the construction activities. No additional tree clearing is required for the laydown area. As long as typical best management practices (i.e. street cleaning, gravel topdressing, and sediment control devices) are utilized, no additional adverse environmental impacts are expected. DEO fully intends to use these best management practices.
