Specifically, we navigated many customers out of the Enron debacle in California in the early 2000's. Since then, we have been providing objective consulting on procurement. We have also served as subject matter experts for PWC (Pricewaterhouse Coopers) in energy procurement services. We have worked in most deregulated states and territories in the country either as direct customer to company relationship or as subject matter experts behind PWC.

Ecom-Energy, Inc. contracts with customers using a commission-based, per unit fee; flat rate, annual fixed fee; or annual membership that may be appropriate given the scope of services. Fees are transparently presented in an 'open book' format that allows customers to choose their preferred fee structure.

Billing statements are provided annually with accompanying invoices. Customers that prefer commission-based, per unit fees receive bills directly from the supplier.

Complaints and inquiries are handled at the executive level and are addressed immediately via an open line of communication. Customers are given direct access to suppliers to address any supply-specific complaints or inquiries.

In its history, no customer has ever filed a complaint with Ecom-Energy of California, Inc.
