# Notice of **Amendment Application for Proposed Utility Facility**

On May 16, 2019, the OPSB issued a Certificate to Hardin Solar Energy II, LLC (Hardin Solar II) for the construction, operation, and maintenance of a solar-powered electric generation facility of up to 170 megawatts (MW) in Hardin County, Ohio, in Case No. 18-1360-EL-BGN. On July 31, 2020, as supplemented on August 24, and September 3 and 25, 2020, Hardin Solar II filed an application with the Ohio Power Siting Board (OPSB) proposing a modification to the boundary within which Hardin Solar II's 170-MW solar-powered generation Facility will be located, in Case No. 20-1321-EL-BGA. The purpose of the project is to generate electricity and its intended function is to supply renewable energy.

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The public hearing will be held on December 7, 2020, beginning at 10:00 a.m. Persons that wish to provide testimony must pre-register with the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (PUCO) before 12:00 p.m. on December 4, 2020, at https://opsb.ohio.gov/wps/portal/gov/opsb/events/hardin-solar-adjudicatory-hearing or by calling 1-800-686-7826. Individuals who have registered to testify will be asked to speak beginning shortly after 10:00 a.m. All those registered to testify should be prepared to speak at that time. 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
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The following map shows the proposed layout of the amendment:

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

This Veterans Day we reflected on the sacrifices made by those who volunteered to defend the United States. But let's also find time to consider that these sacrifices were undertaken to defend values that our ruling-class-in-waiting seeks to undermine. Many students at elite colleges don't realize that they are protected by the very principles they despise and the people to whom they condescend.

Veterans Day is a tribute to all military veterans who have served in the U.S. Armed Forces. Major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918, when the Armistice with Germany went into effect.

Rob Henderson, a doctoral candidate and an Air Force veteran, says it is his observation that the men and women in the military are predominantly working-and-middle-class people who swear an oath to defend with their lives the U.S. Constitution, including the First and Second amendments.


While on campus, Henderson found the affluent college students tend to regularly trash the First and seek to dismantle the Second. He is dismayed to see the ones being groomed for success and power are trying to undermine American values.

In truth, many of the rich kids at elite colleges love American values, too. But they know that loving the Constitution and its first two amendments marks one as working-class or low-status, and that being against those things codes as educated. So they rail against those values to distinguish themselves from one crowd and fit into another.

Seeing his peers question the Constitution is a jarring experience for veterans, says Henderson. Veterans on campus are also shocked by the treatment of race. That should be a concern of all Americans.

The military is perhaps the most meritocratic institution in the U.S. Women and men of all backgrounds come together, united in their purpose to defend this great country. The best research we have shows that women and nonwhite service members report greater job satisfaction and quality of life than do white male members.

Let's use this annual occasion to salute all past, current and future military veterans. We owe all of them our deepest gratitude.



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
