ALJ FULLIN: Thank you. Good evening and welcome, everyone. My name is Dan Fullin, and with me is David Hicks. We are Administrative Law Judges in the Legal Department of the Ohio Power Siting Board and have been assigned to this proceeding.

One of the duties of the Administrative

Law Judges assigned by the Board includes conducting
a public hearing in Case No. 19-1066-EL-BTX which
involves the application filed by Republic Wind, LLC,
for a certificate to construct a transmission line in
Seneca County, Ohio.

Due to the COVID-19 emergency that remains in effect under Executive Order 2020-01D which was issued by the Governor of Ohio, today's hearing is being held through Webex which enables interested persons to offer testimony on the proposed project by telephone or video by way of the internet. The hearing is also being live streamed at www.youtube.com/user/pucoio -- pucohio one word.

Before we get started with the public hearing, I would like to address some preliminary issues. First, if you experience technical

options to address the issue. If your internet connection drops at any point, you can try to join Webex again by video, or you can participate by phone. If those options are unsuccessful, please call the Board's Legal Department, and their number is (614) 466-6843. Call them immediately for assistance.

Finally, if you merely wish to listen to the hearing using your phone instead of accessing by way of Webex on the internet, you can view the live stream on the YouTube channel, or you can listen to the hearing by dialing 1-408-418-9388 and entering the meeting number which is 1736388904.

More information about the Webex technical help options can be obtained through the chat feature which will be available throughout the hearing. You may click on that chat button at any time to obtain technical assistance or ask procedural questions during the hearing. The chat feature should be -- should not be used for any other purpose such as to offer comments.

ALJ HICKS: I can wrap it up, Dan.

ALJ FULLIN: Okay. Go ahead.

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ALJ HICKS: So as Dan was saying, the chat feature should not be used for any other purpose such as to offer comments about the proposed project that's the subject of the hearing. Please also be aware that chats are recorded and should not be considered private. Chats are also not part of the official record in this case.

As indicated by the entry of October 30, 2020, witnesses were to register to testify.

Individuals who have registered to provide testimony should be ready to speak when we read their name from the registration list.

Individuals who are commenting by video will be unmuted by a Board staff member when it is time for their testimony. If you are providing your testimony by telephone, a Board staff member will call you at the phone number you provided when it is your turn to testify. I think it was commented earlier one witness is ready to go that way.

Please bear with us as we work to queue up each individual. In this case it sounds like that's already been achieved. So that should not be an issue. Also consistent with the entry of October 30, 2020, we ask that you keep your testimony to 5 minutes in length and avoid repetitive comments.

To avoid unnecessary background noise, we would ask that you keep your mic -- everyone, not just the witness, but everyone keep your mics on mute unless commenting. Again, if you have questions about this process as the hearing proceeds, please use the chat function in Webex.

Are there any questions from anyone before we officially proceed?

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Hearing none, I think we will go ahead and move into the formal proceeding.

The Ohio Power Siting Board has scheduled for hearing at this time and place -- excuse me.

Actually go on the record officially, Karen, if we are good to go?

COURT REPORTER: Yes.

ALJ HICKS: Okay. So the Ohio Power Siting Board has called for hearing at this time and place Case No. 19-1066-EL-BTX which is captioned in the Matter of the Application of Republic Wind, LLC, for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need to Construct a Transmission Line in Seneca County, Ohio.

As mentioned earlier, my name is David Hicks. Also on the line is Dan Fullin. We are Administrative Law Judges in the Board's Legal

Department and will be conducting today's hearing.

In addition to Administrative Law Judge
Fullin and myself, there are other members of the
Board assisting with various aspects of the hearing
including Micah Schmidt, Aubrey Barker, Matt Butler,
Jill Coker, and Brittany Waugaman who will be
overseeing the event on Webex and YouTube.

And at this time we will go ahead and take appearances by counsel of the parties to the case.

MR. BORCHERS: Thank you, your Honor. On behalf of the Applicant, Dylan Borchers with the law firm of Bricker & Eckler, 100 South Third Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215. Thank you.

ALJ HICKS: Thank you, Mr. Borchers.

The subject of today's hearing is an application filed by Republic Wind, LLC, for the purpose of constructing and operating a transmission line in Seneca County, Ohio. Specifically, the Applicant proposes to construct a 7.4 mile 138 kilovolt transmission line and point of interconnection switchyard to be used for delivering power from the Republic wind farm which is the subject of a pending application in another case captioned -- with Case No. 17-2295-EL-BGN.

Republic Wind, LLC's application was filed on August 27, 2019, and was supplemented on February 25, 2020. I would also note that the Board's Staff filed a Report of Investigation on August 13, 2020. This report is a recommendation from the Board's Staff and does not necessarily reflect what the Board's final determination in the case will be.

The purpose of today's public hearing is to receive testimony regarding Republic Wind, LLC's application from entities and persons in the local community who are affected by the proposed project but who are not parties to the case.

The public hearing is not a question and answer session but is an opportunity to let the Board know what you think about the proposed project.

Today's public hearing is only one aspect of the process in this case. An evidentiary hearing is scheduled to begin on Tuesday, January 28, 2021, also via Webex. The purpose of the evidentiary hearing is for the parties in this case including the Applicant and Board Staff, there are no Intervenors in the case, to provide testimony and other evidence regarding the project.

Tonight's hearing is being transcribed by

a court reporter from Armstrong & Okey. If you plan to testify, please speak clearly so that the court reporter can accurately reflect your comments on the record. Please make sure that you verbally respond to all questions asked -- asked in order that they can be properly transcribed.

Once I'm finished up with this introduction, I will call the individual on the registration list to testify about the proposed project. Each person registered to testify will be permitted to speak once about the project. We will ask you to take an oath or affirmation that what you are about to say is the truth. Your testimony will then be considered as part of the official record in this case and will be reviewed by the Board before a final decision is made on the application.

Additionally, counsel for the Applicant as well as myself and Judge Fullin will be permitted to ask you questions about your testimony. Should you decide that you do not want to testify when I call your name from the registration list, you can express that at that point. Also once you are finished -- finished testifying, you are free to go at any time. You don't have to stick around for things to wrap up.

The Board appreciates everyone's participation in tonight's hearing and wants everyone registered to testify to have the opportunity to do so. And so at this time I believe we are set to go ahead and begin testimony with our lone witness.

So if the host would go ahead and promote Mr. Baldosser, I apologize if I mispronounced that,

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MR. SCHMIDT: Mr. Baldosser, you've been promoted. Please enable your audio and video.

MR. BALDOSSER: Yes. Can you hear me?

ALJ HICKS: Yes, we can. Good evening.

MR. BALDOSSER: I have been getting a lot of pixelating in some of your comments, so I'm hoping -- I'm hoping it -- my bandwidth will carry the testimony.

ALJ HICKS: I can hear you now.

MR. BALDOSSER: I would like to begin first by saying thank you to Mr. Butler. I would like to begin by thanking Mr. Butler and Mr. Hicks and thanking the Power Siting Board and staff for coordinating the public comment forum.

ALJ HICKS: I just --

MR. BALDOSSER: Yes.

ALJ HICKS: -- need to swear you in before you begin.

MR. BALDOSSER: Yes, sir.

ALJ HICKS: Could you please raise your right hand.

ALJ HICKS: Okay. And could you also please provide your address including the township, if any.

MR. BALDOSSER: My home address is 5120 Township Road 78, Republic, Ohio. ZIP Code is 44867. And I am a resident of Adams Township.

ALJ HICKS: Okay. And do you reside or work within the project area that is the subject of this case?

MR. BALDOSSER: Yes, I do.

ALJ HICKS: Okay. Thank you. Please go ahead with your testimony.

MR. BALDOSSER: Yes. Thank you again to Mr. Butler and thank you, Mr. Hicks, and to the Siting Board and staff for coordinating the public comment forum.

As I said, I am Gary Baldosser and I am a fourth generation farmer in Seneca County and I work with my two sons who are the fifth generation of our family to live and work in our community.

Now, I always begin every conversation about our renewable energy project by stating my

position. I am in favor of developing this transmission line project as well as the wind generation project it will support. I live, I work, I own land, and pay real estate taxes within the footprint of the transmission project as well as the generation project.

And we, our family, will be impacted by every manner of this project in this event. I support the construction of the transmission phase of the project not just because it supports the generation side of the project, but I support it as a greater part of the conversation about investing in rural America.

Society has established a new minimum level of expectations. Our rural communities have the same expectations as our urban neighbors. They expect access to high speed broadband. They expect reliable cellular and data coverage. They expect fire and EMS services will be there when they call. And they expect to have electricity every time they flip a switch or want to recharge a device.

All of these things take an investment, an investment in our rural community to meet those expectations. Now, I understand that some people may not see the need for this transmission

infrastructure, but our community has embraced this investment, not by speaking loudly at meetings or posting comments on social media but by partnering with private industry and leasing their personal resources, their land, to make all of our communities better.

There is a great opportunity here to leverage private resources with the developing industry and local government to become the next greatest generation within our community.

In 1936, my Great Grandfather Louis
Baldosser and his rural neighbors identified a need
in their community. That need was electricity. They
knew that no one would bring electricity to their
rural homes and farms and that they needed to act.

Great Grandfather Louis, along with his neighbors, signed the original charter to create the North Central Electric Cooperative. And as I understand the story, they went way beyond that and put some of their own money into the coop to provide startup capital.

Our community is where it is at today because some visionary leaders took action to invest and share their resources with their neighbors. Like my great grandfather, my vision is that we need to

act now and invest the resources we have into our community to allow it to prosper, thrive, and support generations to come.

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I would urge and be very pleased if the Power Siting Board would approve the certificate for construction for the Republic Wind, LLC, transmission lines. I would be more than happy to continue the discussion and try to answer any questions that you might have.

ALJ HICKS: Thank you, Mr. Baldosser.

Judge Fullin, Mr. Borchers, I will open it to either of you. Do either of you have any questions?

ALJ FULLIN: I don't have any questions at this time, but I did want to very much thank

Mr. Baldosser for his testimony. Appreciate what he had to say.

MR. BORCHERS: Likewise. Thank you, your Honor. I have no questions.

ALJ HICKS: Okay. Mr. Baldosser, we appreciate again. I echo Judge Fullin's comments and appreciate your testimony and taking the time to be on with us.

MR. BALDOSSER: Well, thank you very much. I am only picking up pieces of it, but I appreciate the opportunity to participate.

ALJ HICKS: Thank you.

ALJ FULLIN: I was hearing everything you said loud and clear on my end, and we will have a transcript of it too so. Thank you.

ALJ HICKS: With that, Mr. Baldosser being our only witness, I believe that concludes the registered individuals to testify. I want to thank everyone who participated in the public hearing and a special thanks to staff here at the Board that help us get all of this up and running via Webex and continue these public hearings. And thank you to everyone who tuned in via Webex or attended via phone.

Judge Fullin, if you have nothing else, I think that wraps up the -- today's public hearing.

ALJ FULLIN: I would agree. We can conclude the hearing today, and I thank everyone who participated or who attended.

ALJ HICKS: All right. Thank you, everyone. We are adjourned.
