MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT OF WALMART INC.

On November 30, 2020, the Dayton Power and Light Company ("DPL" or "Company") filed an application to increase its electric distribution rates. Walmart seeks to participate in this proceeding as an intervenor, and its Motion to Intervene in these proceedings is timely filed as no deadline for intervention has yet been established by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio ("Commission").

Section 4903.221 of the Ohio Revised Code and Rule 4901-1-11 of the Ohio Administrative Code establish the standards for intervention in proceedings pending before the Commission. Specifically, the Commission considers, among other factors, the direct interests of the party, whether the intervention by the prospective party will unduly prolong or delay the proceedings, and whether the party will significantly contribute to the full development and equitable resolution of the factual issues. A review of these factors in light of the facts set forth herein support granting Walmart's Motion to Intervene.

Walmart is a national retailer of goods and services throughout the United States. Walmart maintains it headquarters at 2608 SE J Street, Bentonville, Arkansas 72716, but also has the

privilege of providing its retail services in the State of Ohio, including within the Company's

service territory. In particular, Walmart has 21 facilities in the Company's service territory,

including stores, a distribution center, and a gas station. Walmart is a large customer of the

Company, purchasing approximately 81 million kWh annually from the Company.

The outcome of this proceeding is likely to impact the price, reliability, and adequacy of

the electric service Walmart receives from the Company in Ohio; thus, Walmart has a direct and

substantial interest in the outcome of this proceeding. Moreover, as a single commercial customer

that purchases substantial amounts of electric and related services from the Company pursuant to

multiple accounts, Walmart's interest in these proceedings is unique. Walmart's participation will

not delay the proceedings nor prejudice any parties. Walmart intends to submit testimony,

participate in hearings, and brief issues in a manner that will assist in the development of a full

evidentiary record. Indeed, Walmart has been a participant in other cases before the Commission

involving rates charged by the Company and costs recovered from customers.

Walmart requests that the Commission grant its Motion to Intervene and that the rights of

a full party of record be conferred upon it. For purposes of receiving service in the proceeding,
