# Authorizing Ordinance

# ORDINANCE NO. 13-10

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING ALL ACTIONS NECESSARY TO EFFECT A GOVERNMENTAL ELECTRICITY AGGREGATION PROGRAM WITH OPTOUT PROVISIONS PURSUANT TO SECTION 4928.20 OHIO REVISED CODE, DIRECTING THE SANDUSKY COUNTY, HURON COUNTY, AND ERIE COUNTY BOARDS OF ELECTIONS TO SUBMIT A BALLOT QUESTION TO THE ELECTORS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Whereas, The Ohio Legislature has enacted electric deregulation legislation ("Am. Sub. S.B. No. 3") which authorizes the legislative authorities of municipal corporations, townships and counties to aggregate the retail electrical loads located within the respective jurisdictions and to enter into service agreements to facilitate for those loads the purchase and sale of electricity ("Governmental Aggregation"); and

. Whereas, Such legislative authorities may exercise such authority jointly with any other legislative authorities; and

Whereas, Governmental Aggregation provides an opportunity for residential and small business consumers to participate collectively in the potential benefits of electricity deregulation through lower electricity rates which would not otherwise be available to those electricity customers individually; and

Whereas, this Council, seeks to establish a Governmental Aggregation program with opt-out provisions pursuant to Section 4928.20, Ohio Revised Code (the "Aggregation Program") for the residents, businesses and other electric consumers in the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Bellevue, Huron, Sandusky, and Erie Counties, Ohio:

Section 1: This Council finds and determines that it is in the best interest of the City, its residents, businesses and other electric consumers located within the corporate limits of the City to establish this Aggregation Program in the City. Provided that the Aggregation Program is approved by the electors of the City pursuant to Section 2 of this Ordinance, the City is hereby authorized to automatically aggregate, in accordance with Section 4928.20, Ohio Revised Code, the retail electric loads located within the City, and, for that purpose, to enter into service agreements to facilitate for those loads the purchase and sale of electricity. The City may exercise such authority jointly with any other municipal corporation, township or county or other political subdivision of the State of Ohio to the full extent permitted by law. The aggregation will occur automatically for each person owning, occupying, controlling or using an electric load center proposed to be aggregated and will provide for the opt-out rights described in Section 3 of this Ordinance.

Section 2: The Board of Elections of Sandusky County, Huron County, and Erie County are hereby directed to submit the following question to the electors of the City at the general election on November 2, 2010:

Shall the City of Bellevue have the authority to aggregate the retail electric load located in the City, and for that purpose, enter into services agreements to facilitate for those loads the sale and purchase of electricity, such aggregation to occur automatically except where any person elects to opt out?

The Clerk of this Council is instructed to immediately file a certified copy of this ordinance and the proposed form of the ballot question with the County Board of Elections not less than seventy-five days prior to the general election. The Aggregation Program shall not take effect unless approved by a majority of the electors voting upon this ordinance and the Aggregation Program provided for herein at the election held pursuant to this Section 2 and Section 4928.20, Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3: Upon approval of a majority of the electors voting at the general election provided for in Section 2 of this Ordinance, this Council, individually or jointly with any other political subdivision, may develop a plan of operation and governance for the Aggregation Program. Before adopting such plan, this Council shall hold at least two public hearings on the plan. Before the first hearing, notice of the hearings shall be published once a week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the City. The notice shall summarize the plan and state the date, time and place of each hearing. No plan adopted by this Council shall aggregate the electric load of any electric load center within the City unless it, in advance, clearly discloses to the person owning, occupying, controlling, or using the load center that the person will be enrolled automatically in the Aggregation Program and will remain so enrolled unless the person affirmatively elects by a stated procedure not to be so enrolled. The disclosure shall state prominently the rates, charges, and other terms and conditions, of enrollment. The stated procedure shall allow any person enrolled in the Aggregation Program the opportunity to opt- out of the program at least every three years, without paying a switching fee. Any such person that opts out of the Aggregation Program pursuant to the state procedure shall default to the standard service offer provided under division (a) of Section 4928.35, Ohio Revised Code until the person chooses an alternative supplier.

Section 4: It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that the deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 5: This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City and the inhabitants thereof, and for further reasons that this ordinance is required to be immediately effective in order to file a certified copy of this ordinance and the proposed form of the ballot question with the Sandusky County, Huron County, and Brie County Boards of Elections not later than seventy-five (75) days prior to the November 2, 2010 election, as provided herein; wherefore, provided it receives the affirmative vote of at least five members elected and appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and

### RESOLUTION R-12-10

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ADOPTION OF AN ELECTRIC POWER. AGGREGATION PLAN OF OPERATION AND GOVERNANCE FOR THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, ERIE, HURON AND SANDUSKY COUNTIES, OHIO, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHERAS, the electorate of the City of Bellevue has previously authorized the City to determine the best policy for the community's residents relating to electric power aggregation; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Bellevue has previously authorized an agreement with FirstEnergy Solutions to provide a contract for electric services and has held two public hearings on the Plan of Operations and Governance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Bellevue, Erie, Huron and Sandusky Counties, Ohio that:

SECTION 1: The City Council of the City of Bellevue hereby adopts an Electric Power Aggregation Plan of Operation and Governance for the City of Bellevue pursuant to PUCO regulations.

SECTION 2: A copy of said Plan is hereby attached and marked as "Exhibit A" and is made a part of this resolution.

SECTION 3: This resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health, safety and welfare for the reason that immediately adopting the City of Bollevue Electric Power Aggregation Plan of Operation and Governance for the City of Bellevue electric aggregation program will allow consumers to reduce their electric bills at the earliest possible time, and provided the resolution receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected to the Bellevue City Council, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest time allowed by law.

WHEREFORE, this Resolution shall go into full force and effect immediately upon its passage by Council and approval by the Mayor.
