Dear Secretary Troupe:

Pursuant to Infinite Energy, Inc.'s ("Infinite Energy") notice filed on October 23, 2020 in the above captioned docket, and in accordance with Ohio Administrative Code ("O.A.C.") §4901-1-27-11, Infinite Energy hereby provides notice to the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio ("Commission") of material changes to its Competitive Retail Natural Gas Supplier certification ("CRNGS") attached hereto.¹

Effective December 18, 2020, Infinite Energy's parent company Infinite Energy Holdings, Inc., sold its gas concerns - Infinite Energy and Dragon Energy LLC ("Dragon"), to Gas South, LLC, ("Gas South") a wholly owned natural gas marketing subsidiary of Cobb Electric Membership Corporation. A holding company (Wolverine Gas, LLC) was formed in October 2020 for Infinite Energy and Dragon. Wolverine Gas, LLC is a wholly owned subsidiary of Gas South. Concurrent with the closing of the sale to Gas South, Infinite Energy changed its corporate structure from a Florida corporation to a Georgia limited liability company — its name will now reflect the new corporate structure, Infinite Energy, LLC.

As a result of the acquisition, Infinite Energy hereby notifies the Commission of the following material changes to its CRNGS certification and should be updated accordingly:

- Infinite Energy's updated legal name and principal address. Sections A-2, A-3, A-5, A-6, A-9, and A-13. See attached CRNGS Provider Application and Exhibit A.
- Infinite Energy's updated principal officers, directors, and partners. Section A-12. See attached Exhibit B.
- Infinite Energy's updated Jurisdiction of Operations and Experience and Plans. Sections B-1 and B-2. See attached Exhibit C.

Following the acquisition, Gas South intends to operate Infinite Energy in substantially the same manner as it was previously operated in accordance with the applicable rules governing CRNGS suppliers in the Ohio Administrative Code and the Ohio Revised Code and does not anticipate any further material changes to Infinite Energy's CRNGS certificate at this time. If, however, Infinite Energy does experience additional material changes beyond what is detailed in this letter, Infinite Energy will notice the Commission and its staff accordingly.

Gas South's acquisition of Infinite Energy will have no impact on Infinite Energy's financial and technical capabilities to continue performing as a certified CRNGS supplier, nor will it impact Infinite Energy's ability to obtain sufficient gas supplies to meet the needs of its customers. The acquisition will have no impact on Infinite Energy's customers.

Once approved by the Commission, please issue a revised CRNGS certificate for Infinite Energy. Please contact me should you have any questions or concerns.

Founded in 1994, Infinite Energy initially focused in wholesale trading, began serving commercial, industrial, and public utility natural gas customers in Florida. In 1999, Infinite Energy began serving residential and non-residential customers in Georgia's newly restructured natural gas market; to this day, Infinite Energy remains as one of the three original marketers to serve the Georgia market.

The company expanded its retail gas operations into New York and New Jersey in 2004 where it served residential and non-residential customers. In 2018, Infinite Energy entered the Ohio and West Virginia retail gas markets and began serving non-residential customers; in 2019 the company exited the New York retail gas market. The company formed an affiliate, named Infinite Electric, which has served the Texas retail electric market since 2010.

In the fourth quarter of 2020, Infinite Energy Holdings, Inc. sold its gas concerns – Infinite Energy, Inc. ("Infinite Energy") and Dragon Energy LLC ("Dragon"), to Gas South, LLC, ("Gas South") a wholly owned natural gas marketing subsidiary of Cobb Electric Membership Corporation. 
