To Whom it may concern:

Upon working with our community of residents and conducting additional research since the announcement from Invenergy, LLC, we are asking your consideration and further diligence in getting our community the following answers prior to approving any application for Cadence Solar.

We ask you support Ohio HB786 in an effort to further explore the concerns from our local townships.

1. It's imperative the materials used to construct the solar panels do not contain hazardous materials to affect our drinking water, creeks, streams, rivers causing polluted water ways for ourselves as well as our livestock. Our residents are asking for a material data sheet to be forthcoming to the public as well as the OPSB. Upon a visit to the Hardin Solar site there was a considerable amount of standing water which is a grave concern if redirected to our properties or waterways.
2. We ask that the panels be placed as far away from residential homes to limit any potential depreciation of property values.
3. We ask that the PILOT ensure public services such as schools, senior services, police, fire and rescue benefit financially to the maximum level possible.
4. We ask that the wildlife and their habitats not be destroyed during the course of any approved project. There is significant concern of deer being forced or redirected to our roadways causing an increase number of accidents for our highly traveled streets. .
5. We ask for an additional meeting with Invenergy, LLC to be held as prior notification did not reach all residents in a timely manner and the information provided on their meeting letter was incorrect to access the call.
6. During the Invenergy, LLC call on 12/18/20 residents were informed there were no negative impacts to living near a solar farm. Upon receiving a copy of the neighborhood agreement contract this speaks to "sign offs" on noise, light, EMFs and frequency disturbances. This is of concern and contradicts what the public was told on the call.

These are just a few concerns voiced in our community. Please take these under consideration.
