ALJ SCHABO: We will go on the record.

Good evening and welcome, everyone. My

name is Patricia Schabo. With me is David Hicks. We

are the Administrative Law Judges in the Legal

Department of the Ohio Power Siting Board and are

assigned by the Board to this proceeding which is

Case No. 20-979-EL-BGN.

One of our duties as the assigned

Administrative Law Judges is conducting a public
hearing in this case which involves the application
filed by Arche Energy Project, LLC, for a Certificate
to Construct a Solar-Powered Electric Generation
Facility in Fulton County, Ohio.

Due to the COVID-19 emergency that remains in effect under Executive Order No. 2020-01D issued by the Governor of Ohio in March of 2020, tonight's hearing is being held through Webex which enables interested persons to offer testimony on the proposed project by telephone or video via the internet. The hearing is also being live streamed at www.youtube.com/user/pucohio.

Before we get started with the hearing, I

would like to address some preliminary issues.

First, if you experience technical difficulties,
there are several options to choose from. If your
internet connection drops at any point, you can try
to join Webex again by video, or you can participate
by phone. If those options are unsuccessful, please

Finally, if you merely wish to listen to the hearing using your phone, you can view the live stream on -- sorry. You can view the live stream on the YouTube Channel I mentioned, or you can listen to the hearing by dialing 1-408-418-9388 and entering the meeting No. 1739296368. For more information about the Webex technical help, options can be obtained through the chat feature which will be available throughout the hearing.

You may click on the chat button at any time to obtain technical assistance or to ask procedural questions during the hearing. The chat feature should not be used for any other purposes such as to offer comments about the proposed project that is the subject of tonight's hearing. You should also be aware that the chats are recorded but are not considered private and are not part of the official

record of the case.

As indicated by the entry of October 30, 2020, witnesses were -- were to register to testify. Individuals who have registered to provide testimony should be ready to speak when their name is called from the registration list. Individuals who are commenting by video will be unmuted by Board staff when it is time for their testimony. If you are providing your testimony by telephone, a Board staff member will call you at the phone number you provided when it is your turn.

Please bear with us as we work to queue up each individual and find them which may -- which may take some time. It may also divert our attention at times to what is happening such as in the beginning of this hearing.

Consistent with the entry of October 30, 2020, we ask that you help us to avoid unnecessary background noise and keep your microphones on mute unless you are commenting. Again, if you have any questions about this process as the hearing proceeds, please use the chat function.

Are there any questions or any news from our technical staff before we officially get started with today's proceeding?

Okay. Seeing and hearing none, I will hand this over to my Co-ALJ David Hicks.

ALJ HICKS: Thank you. The Ohio Power Siting Board has scheduled for hearing at this time and place Case No. 20-979-EL-BGN which is captioned In the Matter of the Application of Arche Energy Project, LLC, for a Certificate of Environmental Capability and Public Need.

As mentioned earlier, my name is David Hicks, and I am Co -- Co-Administrative Law Judge with Patricia Schabo. We work in the Board's Legal Department and will be conducting today's hearing. Also want to mention that presiding with us today is Ohio Power -- Ohio Power Siting Board Chair Beth Trombold.

And, Chair Trombold, I didn't know if you had any comments that you might want to make before we move ahead with the hearing.

CHAIRMAN TROMBOLD: Thank you. I just wanted to say good evening, everyone. We appreciate those of you that have joined us. We know this isn't necessarily ideal or what you are looking -- used to in terms of a public hearing if you have ever attended one. We tend to like to do those in person but because of the pandemic this is the best we can

do and we want to hear from you.

We appreciate those of you that have signed up to testify, and I am here today to listen and take back that information as we proceed with this case. So I will turn it back to Judge Hicks and Judge Schabo and appreciate all the PUCO staff that have come out today to also listen in and hear what the constituents out there have to say. Thank you.

ALJ HICKS: Thank you. And as Chair Trombold mentioned, I will just point out there are some other folks on the call in addition to Chair Trombold and myself and Judge Schabo, staff members from the Board assisting in various aspects of the hearing and Webex including Micah Schmidt, Matt Butler, Anna Perry, among others are on overseeing the event on Webex and YouTube.

And with that at this time we will go ahead and take appearances by counsel of parties in the case and will begin with the Applicant.

MS. SHEELY: Good evening, everyone. My name is Sommer Sheely. I am making an appearance on behalf of the Applicant Arche Energy Project, LLC, for the certificate for the Arche Solar Farm.

ALJ HICKS: Thank you. Next on behalf of Board Staff. I don't believe they are on.

And hearing none, we do have one
Intervenor in this case, the Ohio Farm Bureau. I
would open it up now to take appearance. Hearing
none from -- from them as well. I will note though
that while counsel for Board Staff and the Ohio Farm
Bureau may not be participating this evening, there
may be other non-counsel representatives from those
entities attending the public hearing.

So the subject of today's hearing is an application filed by Arche Energy Project, LLC, for the purpose of developing, constructing, and operating a 107 megawatt solar-powered electric generation facility. Specifically the proposed project would occupy approximately 600 acres within a 1,000 acre project area in Gorham Township, Fulton County, Ohio.

Arche Energy Project's application was filed on July 30, 2020, and was supplemented on September 11, 2020. On January 11, 2021, Board Staff filed a Report of Investigation. This report is a recommendation from the Board Staff and does not necessarily reflect what the Board's final determination in the case will be.

The purpose of today's public hearing is to receive testimony regarding Arche Energy Project's

application from entities and persons in the local community who are affected by the proposed project but who are not parties to the case.

I will point out that the public hearing is not a question and answer session but is an opportunity to let the Board know what you think about the proposed project.

Today's public hearing is only one aspect of the process in this case. On February 17, 2021, there will be an evidentiary hearing in this case which will also be conducted via Webex and the purpose of that evidentiary hearing is for the parties in the case including the Applicant, any Intervenors, and Board Staff to provide testimony and other evidence regarding the project.

I will also point out that tonight's hearing is being transcribed by a court reporter, Karen Gibson from Armstrong & Okey. So to anyone that testifies or is speaking, I would just ask that you speak clearly so that the court reporter can accurately reflect your comments on the record and to verbally respond to any questions that may be asked so that those responses can be properly transcribed as well.

After I finish with this introduction, I

will begin calling individuals on the registration list, and hopefully we will be locating these individuals on the registration list to testify about the proposed project. Each person registered to testify will be permitted to speak once about the project. We will ask the witnesses to take an oath or affirmation that what they are about to say is the truth, and your testimony will then be considered as part of the official record in the case and will be reviewed by the Board before a final decision is made on the application.

Additionally, counsel for the Applicant as well as Judge Schabo and myself will be permitted to ask questions about your testimony, and should anyone decide that they do not want to testify when their name is called, they are free to pass to the next witness. Once you have finished testifying or anyone that is on merely observing the public hearing is certainly free to leave the hearing at any time that they wish.

If individuals wish to supplement their testimony with an exhibit for the Board's consideration, a copy of that document along with a reference to the case number, which again is 20-979-EL-BGN, should be provided to the Board no

but wishes to file a public comment regarding the proposed project, you can do that in writing on the Board's website, or you can send it via e-mail to that same e-mail address I just provided, contactopsb@puco.ohio.gov, or again by mail to Ohio Power Siting Board, 180 East Broad Street, Attention Docketing Division, Columbus, Ohio 43215. And again, on those written public comments, they should reference the Case No. 20-979-EL-BGN.

I will just reiterate what others have already said. We appreciate everyone's participation in tonight's hearing. Hopefully those that registered to testify will have the opportunity to do so.

And now would typically be the time where we would begin calling those from the witness list.

I'm not sure if we have been able to contact our two witnesses that registered to testify. So if anyone,

Matt or Micah, I don't know if either one of you want

to chime in as to whether we have been able to get either of them?

ALJ SCHABO: I think efforts -- I am not sure who is trying to talk. I think efforts to this date have been -- or to this time have been unfruitful. Again, I am going to harken back to the good ole days when we were all in the same room, and I am going to give the court reporter a break and go off the record.

(Recess taken.)

ALJ SCHABO: It is now 6:29. We took a small break from the record to make a last attempt, if you will, to contact the two witnesses that registered to testify this evening. We were unsuccessful in doing so.

And my screen just went blank. Okay.

Back up. Sorry. We were unsuccessful in finding our witnesses. I did want to state on the record and otherwise that there can be an opportunity at the beginning of the evidentiary hearing for tonight's witnesses to appear and give testimony at the beginning of that hearing. I will need our witnesses -- if they would like to take advantage of this possibility, I will need Cathy Cowan Becker and Angela Belcher to contact us here at the Board prior

to the evidentiary hearing, that is again scheduled for February 17, and explain -- I'm sorry, for lack of a better phrase, why they weren't able to connect with us this evening. And with demonstration of good cause, we will permit their testimony at the beginning of the evidentiary hearing scheduled for February 17. I hope everything is okay with our witnesses.

In the meantime I would just like to thank everyone that has been with us and stepped through our minefield of this evening's public hearing. So thank you very much.

With that we are adjourned.
