MOTION FOR WAIVER AND MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT

Pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code ("O.A.C."), Pleasant Prairie Solar Energy LLC ("Applicant") respectfully moves the Ohio Power Siting Board ("Board") for a waiver from a part of O.A.C. Chapter 4906-4. This same day the Applicant is filing an application with the Board to construct a solar-powered electric generation facility in Franklin County, Ohio. Although the application is being filed in accordance with O.A.C. Chapter 4906-4, the Applicant seeks a waiver from O.A.C. Rules 4906-4-08(D)(2) through (4) to allow for a reduced study area regarding the review of cultural resources, landmarks, and visual impacts. An explanation of the reasons supporting this motion is detailed in the attached Memorandum in Support.

Accordingly, the Applicant respectfully moves that the Board grant a waiver from O.A.C. Rules 4906-4-08(D)(2) through (4).

MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT OF MOTION FOR WAIVER

I. INTRODUCTION

The Applicant is proposing to construct a solar-powered electric generation Facility of up to 250 megawatts located in Pleasant and Prairie Townships, Franklin County, Ohio. On February 19, 2021, the Applicant filed its application with the Board. The application provides all information necessary for the Board and its Staff to conduct a review and make the determinations necessary under Ohio Revised Code Section 4906.10. As more fully explained below, good cause exists to grant the wavier given the nature of the solar facility.

II. REQUESTED WAIVER

O.A.C. Rules 4906-4-08(D)(2) through (4) require an application for any type of a generation facility to provide certain evaluations of the impact of the proposed facility within 10 miles of the project area. O.A.C. Rule 4906-4-08(D)(2) and (3) require the Applicant to provide an evaluation of the impact of the proposed facility on the preservation and continued meaningfulness of the mapped cultural resources and landmarks, and recreational areas within the 10-mile radius and to describe plans to avoid or mitigate any adverse impact. O.A.C. Rule 4906-4-08(D)(4) requires the Applicant to evaluate the visual impact of the proposed facility within a 10-mile radius from the project area.

The Applicant submits that good cause exists for granting a waiver from those rules to allow for a focused study area of 2 miles for cultural resources and landmarks, and recreational areas. As set forth in the Application the area of potential effects for the project is well below the 2-mile study area. With regard to the visual impact, as explained in Application Exhibits J and R, Viewshed Analysis and Ecological Assessment, respectively, because of the facility's low profile, as well as screening afforded by vegetation and existing structures, visibility of the planned components is anticipated to be limited to the immediate vicinity of the project, which is well under the 5-mile visual impact study area.

Based on the foregoing, the Applicant submits that good cause exists for a waiver from O.A.C. Rules 4906-4-08(D)(2) through (4) to allow for the focused study areas, rather than a 10mile study area. Notably, the Board has granted similar waivers to other solar projects in the past. *In re Application of Willowbrook Solar I, LLC*, Case No. 18-1024-EL-BGN, Entry (Oct. 4, 2018); *In re Application of Angelina Solar I, LLC*, Case No. 18-1579-EL-BGN, Entry (Jan. 17, 2019); *In re Application of Arche Energy Project, LLC*, Case No. 20-979-EL-BGN, Entry (Sept. 23, 2020); *In re Application of Fox Squirrel Solar, LLC*, Case No. 20-931-EL-BGN, Entry (Nov. 23, 2020).

III. CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, the Applicant requests that the Board grant its motion for waiver from O.A.C. Rules 4906-4-08(D)(2) through (4).
