


Figure 63. Fieldwork results and photo orientation map.




Figure 65. Fieldwork results and photo orientation map.




Figure 67. Fieldwork results and photo orientation map.




Figure 68. Fieldwork results and photo orientation map.




Figure 73. Fieldwork results and photo orientation map.





42. Further Description of Important Interior and Exterior Features

The resource is a two-story, frame, end-gable, Greek Revival house. The roof is covered in historic standing seam metal. The historic windows are six-over-six and the exterior walls are clad in historic clap board. The center window on the second floor has multi-pane sidelights. The pedimented porch is supported by round Doric columns standing on square plinths. The front door has an elaborate surround that includes Ionic pilasters and narrow panes of glass in the sidelights and transom.

43. History and Significance

Greek Revival was the dominant style of American domestic architecture from c. 1825-1860 and was known for most of that time as the National Style. The house appears under the ownership of the Miller family in both the 1875 *Combination Atlas Map of Licking County, Ohio* by L.H. Everts and the 1866 *Atlas of Licking County, Ohio* by E.W. Beers. The Licking County Auditor's Office indicates that the house was built in 1843.

The resource has all the exterior character-defining features that identify Greek Revival. Character-defining features exhibited in this resource include the low pitched roof, a wide band of trim at the cornice, multi-pane window sash, pediment porch supported by columns and the elaborate door surround that includes narrow panes of glass in the sidelights and transom. The property maintains superb integrity of exterior materials as the siding, trim, windows and porch all appear to be historic.

44. Description of Environment and Outbuildings (See #52)

The house is situated on a rural, 96-acre lot on the south side of Creek Road SW. The house is surrounded by mature trees and a lawn. There are two modern residences to the east of the house under the ownership of the same family. A barn, a shed and a garage dating from the 1940s are located to the east of the house.

42. Further Description of Important Interior and Exterior Features

The resource is a two-story, frame, hipped cross-gable, Italianate house. The roof is covered in asphalt shingles and the exterior walls are clad in vinyl siding. The windows are modern replacements. A porch wraps around the southeast corner and is supported by turned wooden posts. A brick chimney is located off-center within the roof plane.

43. History and Significance

The Italianate style was most popular in the United States from 1840 to 1880. No house appears at this location in the 1866 *Atlas of Licking County, Ohio* by E.W. Beers but one does appear here in the 1875 *Combination Atlas Map of Licking County, Ohio* by L.H. Everts. The Licking County Auditor's Office indicates that the house was built in 1900; however, our opinion is that the house was constructed c. 1870.

44. Description of Environment and Outbuildings (See #52)

The house is situated on a rural, 131-acre lot on the north side of Creek Road SW. The house is surrounded by mature trees and a lawn. There are several barns, sheds, grain bins and silos on the farm all dating from the mid to late 20th century.





The resource is a two-story, frame, cross-gable, eclectic house. The roof is covered in asphalt shingles and the exterior walls are clad in stucco and stone veneer. The windows are modern replacements. A very large addition has been constructed at the rear (west) elevation. The front porch has been enclosed (or an addition constructed) obscuring the front door. The house appears to be highly altered.

43. History and Significance

A BUILDING APPEARS AT THIS LOCATION ON THE USGS 1907 THURSTON, OH (HTMC, 1936 ED.) 15 MINUTE (TOPOGRAPHIC) MAP (FIGURE 7); HOWEVER, IT IS NOT CONFIRMED THAT THIS IS THE SAME HOUSE AS THE LICKING COUNTY AUDITOR'S OFFICE INDICATES THAT THE HOUSE WAS BUILT IN 1940. THE ADDITIONS AND MODIFICATIONS HINDER INTERPRETATION.

The house is situated on a rural, 30-acre lot on the west side of Watkins Road and surrounded by mature trees and ornamental shrubs. There are two modern barns, four silos and a shed to the west and north of the house.

The resource appears to be a heavily modified and expanded one and one half-story, frame, front-gable, vernacular house. The roof is covered in asphalt shingles and the exterior walls are clad in wooden siding. The windows and exterior doors are modern replacements. Dormer windows pierce the roof at the west and south elevations. A large, covered porch and balustrade also wraps around the west and south elevations. 



The resource is a one-story, frame, side-gable, vernacular Ranch house with integrated garage. The roof is covered in asphalt shingles and the exterior walls are clad in vinyl siding. The windows and exterior door are modern replacements. A small, shed porch covers the front entrance and is supported by metal posts. The house stands on a concrete block foundation. Typical of Ranch houses, the house has two front entrances, a large picture window and smaller secondary windows.
