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ALJ AUGOSTINI: Good evening, and welcome everyone. My name is Lauren Augostini and with me is Jacky St. John. We are Administrative Law Judges in the Legal Department of the Ohio Power Siting Board, and we have been assigned by the Board to this proceeding, which is Case No. 20-1084-EL-BGN.

2.1

One of our duties as the assigned

Administrative Law Judges is conducting a public

hearing in this case which involves the Application

filed by Powell Creek Solar, LLC, for a Certificate

to construct a solar farm in Putnam County, Ohio.

Due to the COVID 19 emergency that remains in effect under Executive Order No. 2020-01(D) issued by the Governor of Ohio in March 2020, tonight's hearing is being held through Webex, which enables interested parties and persons to offer testimony on the proposed project by telephone or video via the internet. The hearing is also being live streamed on YouTube.

Before we get started with the public hearing I would first like to address some preliminary issues. First, if you experience any technical difficulties during the hearing you have several options.

ALJ AUGOSTINI: I don't see or hear any questions, so at this time it appears that all of our -- I believe all of our registrants are ready, and let's proceed to the formal part of our proceeding. I'll hand it over to you, Judge St. John. Thank you.

ALJ ST. JOHN: Thank you. The Ohio

Power Siting Board has scheduled for hearing at this

time and place Case No. 20-1084-EL-BGN, which is

captioned In the Matter of the Application of Powell

Creek Solar, LLC, for a Certificate of Environmental

Compatibility and Public Need.

My name is Jacky St. John, and with me is Lauren Augostini. We are Administrative Law Judges in the Board's Legal Department, and we will be conducting today's hearing.

I'd like to note that we also have Ohio

Power Siting Board Staff members attending this

conference, including Micah Schmidt, Jill Kocher,

Matt Schilling, Aubrey Barker, and Brittany Waugaman,

who will be overseeing the event on Webex and

YouTube.

At this time we will take the appearances of counsel for the parties to this case. We'll begin with the Applicant.

2.1

MR. BORCHERS: Thank you, your Honor.

Good evening. On behalf of the Applicant, Dylan

Borchers and Sommer Sheely, with the law firm of

Bricker & Eckler, 100 South Third Street, Columbus,

Ohio 43215.

ALJ ST. JOHN: Thank you. And I'll also note for the record that counsel for Ohio Farm Bureau Federation and counsel for Staff are not present this evening.

The subject of today's hearing is an Application filed by Powell Creek Solar, LLC, for the purpose of developing, constructing, and operating a new 150-megawatt solar farm. The solar farm would be located in Palmer and Liberty Townships in Putnam County. Powell Creek's Application was filed on October 7th, 2020, and was supplemented on October 29th, 2020.

On March 16th, 2021, Board Staff filed a Report of Investigation. This report is a recommendation from the Board's Staff and does not necessarily reflect what the Board's final determination will be.

The purpose of today's public hearing is to receive testimony regarding Powell Creek Solar's Application from entities and persons in the local community who are affected by the proposed project, but who are not parties to the case.

2.1

The public hearing is not a question and answer session, but is an opportunity to let the Board know what you think about the proposed project. Today's public hearing is only one aspect of this case. An evidentiary hearing is scheduled to begin on Tuesday, April 13th, 2021, via Webex.

The purpose of the evidentiary hearing is for the parties in this case, including the Applicant, Intervenors, and Board Staff, to provide testimony and other evidence regarding this project.

Tonight's hearing is being transcribed by a Court Reporter from Armstrong & Okey. If you plan to testify, please speak clearly so that the Court Reporter can accurately reflect your comments on the record. Please make sure that you verbally respond to all questions asked so that they can be properly transcribed.

After I finish with this introduction we will call the individuals on the registration list to testify about the proposed project. Each person who

registered to testify will be permitted to speak once about the project.

2.1

If you are testifying tonight we will ask you to take an oath or affirmation that what you are about to say is the truth. Your testimony will then be considered as part of the official record in this case, and it will be reviewed by the Board before a final decision is made on the Application.

Additionally, counsel for the parties in this case, as well as Judge Augostini and myself, will be permitted to ask you questions about your testimony.

Should you decide that you do not want to testify when we call your name from the registration list, you can pass to the next witness. Also, once you have finished testifying, or if you are just here to observe, you may leave the hearing at any time that you wish.

The Board appreciates your participation in tonight's hearing and we want everyone who is registered to testify to have the opportunity to do so.

At this time we are going to begin with the testimony. The first witness on our list tonight is Ken Niese. Mr. Schmidt, could you please promote the witness to a panelist role?

MR. SCHMIDT: Mr. Niese is a phone witness. I believe he is on with our Staff.

ALJ ST. JOHN: Okay. Thank you.

ALJ AUGOSTINI: I think we may need to unmute him.

ALJ ST. JOHN: Mr. Niese, can you hear me? I'm not hearing anything. I'm not sure if the

problem is with Mr. Niese not being able to hear me, or with us not being able to hear him.

3 MR. KEN NIESE: We were just talking

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5 ALJ ST. JOHN: We can hear you now. Is 6 this Mr. Niese?

MR. KEN NIESE: Can you hear me?

ALJ ST. JOHN: Yes, we can. I know you're on the telephone, but even so, since we can't see you I'm going to ask you to please raise your right hand.

MR. KEN NIESE: Okay.

ALJ ST. JOHN: And do you swear or affirm that the testimony you're about to provide is the truth?

MR. KEN NIESE: Yes, I do.

ALJ ST. JOHN: Thank you. I have just a few short questions for you before I invite you to begin your testimony. First, please state and spell your name for the record.

MR. KEN NIESE: Okay. My name is Ken Niese. First name is K-e-n, last name is Niese, N-i-e-s-e.

24 ALJ ST. JOHN: Thank you. Please 25 provide your address, including the township.

1 MR. KEN NIESE: My address is 5824 State 2 Route 108, Ottawa, Ohio 45875, and my township is 3 Palmer. ALJ ST. JOHN: Thank you. Do you reside 4 5 or work within the project area? 6 MR. KEN NIESE: I reside in the area. ALJ ST. JOHN: Great. Thank you. 7 8 Please proceed with your testimony. 9 MR. KEN NIESE: Okay. Thank you very 10 much for letting me talk to the Board. To start off, 11 I want to let the Board know that I am not against 12 the Powell Creek Solar farm. 13 I am speaking to you about some concerns 14 I have with the safety on the intersection of State 15 Route 613 and State Route 108. If at any time 16 somebody is wanting to know on a map, let me know and 17 I can stop and go from there. Anyway, the 18 intersection there is just south of Miller City --19 (inaudible.) 20 ALJ ST. JOHN: Mr. Niese, we are having

a little bit of audio issues here on our end. We were hearing -- Mr. Niese, can you hear me?

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MR. KEN NIESE: Yes, I can hear you now.

ALJ ST. JOHN: So where you started dropping off, so you had given the intersection, and

I was able to hear all of that, and then after you gave the intersection, that's where your audio started dropping off.

2.1

MR. KEN NIESE: Okay. The intersection of State Route 613 and 108. Presently three of the four corners will not have solar panels installed on them.

The one in question is in the southwest corner of -- of the intersection, which will have a fence within 100 feet of the leeway from both roads.

And I have lived on the corner of this

State Route 613 and 108 for 40-plus years. I have
witnessed many cars -- vehicles running through the
stop sign on State Route 613, and when the vehicles
from the other -- State Route 108 see them coming,
they will stop before a collision occurs.

Since the panels and the fence will be about nine or ten feet high, this will block the view of the vehicles running the stop sign on 613. So instead of having a hundred foot setback on the southwest corner, it needs to be a 400 foot setback from both State Route 613, for better visual for vehicles to see other vehicles when not stopping for the stop sign.

This will only add an additional .57 of

an acre, or a little over a half acre, to the present 1.2 acres for the first 100 feet setback the way they have it set out.

2.1

This is a small price for ultimate safety. This is a very highly traveled road that the Staff did not mention in this report to the Ohio Power Siting Board listed on page 11 dealing with traffic volume.

The second concern I have deals with the aesthetics of the community. Again, dealing with State Route 108 a half mile south of Miller City and heading into Miller City, panels will be visible by the high traffic volume.

Avangrid has options on land west of their western side of the project 15 feet and south of the Norfolk & Western Railroad. It contains 160 acres of land.

This land is contingent or can be connected to the most western side of the project.

Removing the solar panels a half mile out of Miller City along State Route 108 would help the aesthetics of the town of Miller City, and relocating to the western edge of the option lease ground would greatly enhance the land and the town surrounding the area.

The cost may be higher, but the savings

by the solar panels reducing from 1,050 acres to 933 acres to achieve 150 megawatts, this is a significant savings. (Inaudible.)

ALJ ST. JOHN: Mr. Niese, we're generally hearing you, it's just every once in a while you cut out. Would you mind just maybe moving a few sentences back and starting again? It's just a volume issue that we're noticing, so occasionally the volume drops off too low to hear.

MR. KEN NIESE: Okay. (Inaudible.)

ALJ ST. JOHN: We're still having -it's a little bit better, but not great because we
do -- we are transcribing this, so we want to make
sure that we're getting -- you know, we really want
to hear your testimony. We want to make sure that we
get every word that you say.

Let me see. Could you maybe start now and see if the audio is better at this point, just a few seconds?

20 MR. KEN NIESE: Where do you want me to 21 start?

ALJ ST. JOHN: Mr. Niese, it also may be helpful if you could just slow the speed down a little bit for us. I think that could be helpful as well.

17 1 MR. KEN NIESE: Okay. 2 ALJ ST. JOHN: Unfortunately, I was not 3 able to hear what you --4 MR. KEN NIESE: 150 megawatts -- can you 5 hear me? 6 ALJ ST. JOHN: We can hear you now, yes. 7 MR. KEN NIESE: Okay. I take it you got 8 it where I talk about the solar panels because of the 9 efficiency in reducing from 1,050 acres to 933 acres 10 to achieve the 150 megawatts? 11 ALJ ST. JOHN: Yes. 12 MR. KEN NIESE: Okay. You have that? 13 ALJ ST. JOHN: Yes, we have got that. 14 Thank you. 15 MR. KEN NIESE: It's a significant 16 savings at having them rerouting the solar farm with 17 the aesthetics, or as having -- being a good neighbor 18 to the community. 19 The third concern I have is the noise 20 level from the inverters and tracking motors. As the 2.1 panels move will there be a constant metal grinding? 2.2 I don't know, I have no knowledge of it. So that's 23 one question. 24 Also the wind velocity could be another

problem as the community witnessed a duration in 2011

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or 2012 of winds up to 100 miles an hour, which could compromise the panels.

2.1

In conclusion, these concerns can be mitigated by moving the solar field away from Miller City to a more suitable area which I have described earlier, away from the town that Avangrid has land, or lease options. This will also free up land for Miller City to grow. Thank you.

ALJ ST. JOHN: Thank you, Mr. Niese. I had just one question for you. I wanted to make sure that I understood the first point that you were making.

The intersection that you cited, your suggestion and comment was you would prefer for the fence that is currently planned to be 100 feet back from the intersection to be 400 feet back from the intersection; is that correct?

MR. KEN NIESE: Okay. Yes, I said 400 feet back from the intersection instead of 100 feet. That means 613 and 108.

ALJ ST. JOHN: Okay. Thank you very much. That was the only question that I had for you. Are there any other questions for this witness from counsel or the Bench before we let him go?

MR. BORCHERS: No questions from the

Applicant, your Honor.

2.1

ALJ ST. JOHN: Okay. Thank you. Thank you very much, Mr. Niese. You are excused, and have a nice evening.

MR. KEN NIESE: Okay. Thank you, too.

ALJ ST. JOHN: The next witness on our list tonight is Anna Mae Wenzlick. Mr. Schmidt, could you please promote the next witness to a panelist role?

MR. SCHMIDT: Ms. Wenzlick, you've been promoted. If you could enable the audio and video.

ALJ ST. JOHN: Ms. Wenzlick, we can hear you, we can't see you at the movement. Are you able to turn your video on?

MS. WENZLICK: I don't want to be seen.

ALJ ST. JOHN: Okay, that's fine. No problem at all. We have people providing phone testimony, so that's no problem.

Although we can't see you, I will ask you at this time to please raise your right hand.

And do you swear or affirm that the testimony you're about to provide is the truth?

MS. WENZLICK: I do.

24 ALJ ST. JOHN: Thank you. Please state 25 and spell your name for the record. MS. WENZLICK: My name is Anna Mae
Wenzlick, A-n-n-a, M-a-e, that's two words, and
Wenzlick, W-e-n-z-l-i-c-k. My address is 13854 State
Route 613, Ottawa, Ohio, and I'm in Palmer Township.

ALJ ST. JOHN: Thank you. Do you reside or work within the project area?

MS. WENZLICK: I reside in the area.

ALJ ST. JOHN: All right. Thank you.

And please proceed with your testimony.

2.1

MS. WENZLICK: We have an 80-acre field right across from our home, and I'm wondering why we don't get any of this information. The little bit of information I got, I got from neighbors. I would think that would be a significant amount of acreage for us to know what's going on.

The map I have I'm not sure is the correct map you're going to be using. One map I saw the setback was quite far, the other map it's right up to the road, so I would like to have the proper map.

I was also concerned about maybe having evergreens or some kind of plants put in place for the aesthetics of the fencing. I would rather not have it look like we live near a prison compound.

Another thing, I'm not really opposed to

a solar farm, I just think that we could have done a better job of planning where to put these solar panels, because it seems like the property that you've taken are the most logical places for homes to be built, where families can live and grow. As Ken said, there are other ways to have this solar farm without looking like a sore thumb sticking out there.

2.1

In the one paper I read they talked about light travel in this area. That is not true. When we first moved there I would walk on the highway for exercise. There is no way I would walk on that road now.

There is significant truck traffic.

Many, many times you hear these trucks coming down
the highway and they are screeching their brakes
because they have been daydreaming and they are about
to run the stop sign. Ken also talked about that.

And the height of these panels, nine-and-a-half feet high. That's higher than a corn crop. And when a farmer has a cornfield, he goes in and knocks down a certain amount of the corn so there's visibility all ways, and I think we need to look at the visibility.

There's talk of noise. I understand that the noise will be very loud when they are

installed. That's to be expected with any project, but what about afterwards? I know a drip of water can be minor, but if you have to listen to that drip, drip, drip all day long, all night long, that can be kind of a health hazard, I think.

2.1

Another thing with the lighting, they talk about the lighting and it will be shining into the solar field.

Now, I know that baseball diamonds, they have lighting, but -- and it's shining into the field. But there's a significant amount of lighting that covers the whole area, so I'm wondering if we're going to be living like we're next to the Wal-Mart parking lot. Also, I wonder will a small animal be able to activate the lights, or will the lights be on all the time?

In one paper I read, you talk about permanent and temporary impact that the project will have. The way this is planned, I now see a dying town because there is nowhere for the community to grow. You've taken all the prime real estate and put panels on it.

I also would like to ask where the panels are coming from. Are they coming from China? If so, I was wondering why we can't support our

country, maybe even our local area like Toledo. I think there's a solar panel company up there. That's all I have. Thank you.

2.1

ALJ ST. JOHN: Thank you, Ms. Wenzlick.

I appreciate your testimony this evening. And it sounded to me like you also had a number of questions that you were posing.

As you know, tonight is not a question and answer session, so we won't be able to provide any answers to your questions this evening, but I would recommend that you contact the Applicant to get your questions answered directly, or if you have a question about the Board process, you can contact the Board, and that phone number is 866-270-6772. If you didn't have that phone number already, I can repeat that if you'd like me to.

MS. WENZLICK: Please repeat.

ALJ ST. JOHN: Will do. That number is 866-270-6772.

MS. WENZLICK: Thank you.

ALJ ST. JOHN: You're welcome. Thank you for your testimony, and you're excused at this time.

3 Ottawa, Ohio 45875, and Palmer Township.

ALJ ST. JOHN: Thank you. And do you reside or work within the project area?

MR. SCOTT NIESE: Yes.

ALJ ST. JOHN: Do you reside in the project area --

MR. SCOTT NIESE: Reside.

ALJ ST. JOHN: Okay. Thank you. And please proceed with your testimony.

MR. SCOTT NIESE: My biggest concern is the intersection of State Route 613 and State Route 108.

I live in the northwest corner of that intersection, and as Kenny said, they plan on having the solar panels right up against the road on the southwest section of that intersection, the corner of that intersection.

I've lived here my whole life as well, that's 40 years, and it is an extremely dangerous intersection, especially from traffic coming from the west, heading east on State Route 613.

Essentially coming south out of Miller City, heading south out of Miller City on State Route

108, you can hardly see to the east or west as soon as you get to that intersection.

2.1

Now, if you're heading the opposite direction towards town on State Route 108, you can see just fine. You can see for a mile in each direction. You can see the traffic, west or east.

With the proposed solar panels as they are now at this intersection, of the four corners of that intersection you will only be able to see one corner of it. You'll -- otherwise it is an extremely dangerous intersection. I've witnessed several people go through it on State Route 613.

The other issue I have is with what Anna
Mae said, the aesthetics of the panels and the chain
link fence surrounding it. We would really like to
see some sort of evergreens or something. That's all
I have.

ALJ ST. JOHN: All right. Thank you for your testimony. Are there any questions for this witness from counsel or the Bench?

MR. BORCHERS: No, your Honor.

ALJ ST. JOHN: All right. Thank you for your testimony. You're excused, and have a nice evening.

MR. SCOTT NIESE: You, too.

1 ALJ ST. JOHN: All right. Our next witness on the list is Jim Erford. He does not 2 appear to be connected to Webex by internet or phone. 3 Members of the Board Staff will be 4 5 continuing to try and contact this individual to get 6 them connected so that they can provide testimony 7 this evening. In the meantime, we will move on to 8 our next witness, who is Mr. Greg Kuhlman. 9 Mr. Schmidt, could you please promote the witness to 10 a panelist role? MR. SCHMIDT: Mr. Kuhlman has been 11 12 promoted, if he could even able his audio. 13 MR. ERFORD: I'm Jim Erford, the 14 previous witness. 15 ALJ ST. JOHN: Okay. Great. Thank you. Mr. Erford, we can see and hear you. At this time 16 17 I'd like you to please raise your right hand. Do you 18 swear or affirm that the testimony you're about to 19 provide is the truth? 20 MR. ERFORD: Yes. 2.1 ALJ ST. JOHN: Please state and spell 22 your name for the record. 23 MR. ERFORD: Jim Erford, J-i-m, 24 E-r-f-o-r-d. Address is 110 West Lane Cross Street, 25 Miller City, Ohio 45864.

ALJ ST. JOHN: And do you live in a township as well?

2.1

MR. ERFORD: It's in the Village, but the Village is in Palmer Township.

ALJ ST. JOHN: Thank you. And do you reside or work within the project area?

MR. ERFORD: I reside in the town, and the project is in this area, yeah.

ALJ ST. JOHN: Okay. Thank you. Please proceed with your testimony.

MR. ERFORD: Okay. I've lived in Miller City most of my life, and I've been Mayor since 2004. Miller City is in Putnam County, northwest Ohio, with a population around 140.

We're a tight-knit community and we look out for one another. I'm a strong supporter of the Avangrid Renewables proposed 150-megawatt solar farm near Miller City.

I don't have any personal or financial interest in the project, but the town will greatly benefit from the Powell Creek Solar farm.

Miller City and other local governments have negotiated a 30-year pilot agreement for the project that will result in \$26 million in revenue going to the County, two townships, two school

districts, emergency response agencies, several health and social services in Miller City.

2.1

By far the biggest impact of the project, however, is that it will help Miller City build a new sanitary sewer. A sanitary sewer project is so important to our community that all project stakeholders, all entities in the pilot agreement, project landowners, and Avangrid are pitching in a portion of their project revenue to make it happen.

The lack of sanitary sewer has limited our town's growth for a long time, and impacts the future as well. You can't build a new home in Miller City unless you get a permit from the County to use an existing septic system, or have an acre lot and follow the rules of the County for building a new home in the country.

This issue impacts businesses as well.

We have a convenience store in town that has a holding tank for its restrooms that has to be pumped.

We have had requests for a permit to build a car wash in town, but the County will not permit it without a sanitary sewer.

Our city got water in 2002, and since that time we have been trying to get a sanitary sewer. In 2012 we hired an engineering firm to

determine the costs of installing a sanitary sewer system. They came up with a cost of nearly \$200 per household per month, which is unacceptable.

2.1

With the support of the Powell Creek project our sanitary sewer will cost \$60 per household per month, which is in line with other towns in the area that charge for sewer service.

The Village strongly supports the Powell Creek Solar project. We also have others here that support the project; Norm and Ann and Steve Leebret, Tom and Peg Niese, Denny Verhoff, Kerry Johnson, School Superintendent, and Gary Kuhlman. Thank you.

Miller City is a small town with less than 200 people in it, a church, a high school, Mac and Rita's, and two other food businesses. We all depend on each other, which makes Miller City a great place to live.

Activities at the church and school are what helps to make the businesses and town a success. Miller City has needed a sanitary sewer system for over 20 years. We have tried many times, but it has never worked out.

The town's growth has been limited because of not having the sanitary sewer. Worse than that is the fear that the school may have to close at some point if the town doesn't get sewer. This would devastate Mac and Rita's as well as the whole town of Miller City.

Since Avangrid Renewables has proposed a solar project near Miller City, I have the hope for the growth of our town again.

I am not getting any money from the project, but am thrilled that the pilot negotiated

MS. SEALTS: Your Honor, Staff, and Board members, my testimony is a little different than some of the others tonight.

I'm the Director of Economic Development in Putnam County, and all of the work that we do focuses on attracting capital investments to Putnam County, which includes the Village of Miller City and both of the impacted townships.

And the second part of our job is focused on attracting and retaining employment here in Putnam County, and so those are my two points.

The Powell Creek Solar project, as you've heard from others, will bring millions of dollars of new tax dollars into Putnam County, and this helps fund both the infrastructure and schools and the residents and jobs in our County.

Contrary to what some believe, it

actually opens up the opportunity for new commercial development and residential development. It does not stop those things, it opens those things up.

2.1

Not only does it help the tax base for Miller City and the two affected townships in Putnam County, but it also helps the regional tax base and elevates the entire State of Ohio.

As you know, companies are very interested in what to procure. Less expensive energy and renewable energy helps them do that, and they will locate their businesses wherever it is that they can find renewable energy.

Ohio stands to generate more than \$18 billion from solar projects, and up to 54,000 construction jobs, which is a fact from the Ohio Chambers for Innovation and Clean Energy. And more jobs are actually created from solar projects and renewable energy projects than fossil fuel projects, so it definitely benefits employment.

The availability of renewable energy, we feel, drives capital and drives investments locally, regionally, and for the State of Ohio. And it puts us in a better position to retain and attract companies and retain those to bring stable and high quality jobs to people here locally and throughout

the State of Ohio. Thank you.

Three years ago I received a call wanting me to attend a meeting. A company by the name of Avangrid was interested in putting a solar farm at the edge of town, and my ground might be included in this farm.

I attended the meeting and it was brought up about how much revenue would be raised from the solar farm for the local economic.

The question came up would there be a way that the town and school could secure enough money to install a sewer system from the solar farm revenue. The answer was yes, but it would take cooperation and sharing.

After many meetings and different suggestions, it was agreed that each entity, the Putnam County Commissioners, Palmer Township, Liberty Township, the school, the town, and the landowners would contribute a percentage of the money they would receive toward paying for this system. Avangrid itself has even agreed to put money toward this project.

Seven different entities agreeing and cooperating on a plan to make this happen, everyone was involved in these discussions, no one was blind sided. This all happened because of cooperation. I personally would like to call that cooperation community pride, but it will not be possible without the solar farm.

So as you look through the paperwork, check the maps, listen to the comments at the public meetings, I hope you will see the benefits and positive affects this solar farm will have on our community, and allow this solar farm to be built so our community's dream can become a reality. Thank you for listening.

For years Palmer Township has supported
Miller City in their efforts to extend a waterline to
the community for servicing the school, the Village,
and the fire department, which has been completed.
Also to install a sanitary system within Miller City.

In 2019 Avangrid introduced themselves to Miller City and Palmer Township, and proposed the Powell Creek Solar farm, a 150-watt solar project involving approximately 1,300 acres in Palmer Township and Liberty Township.

The Trustees supported the project because we think that that was the right thing to do. This is one project that could be our answer to improving more township roadways, promoting the Village, and protecting our School District.

Numerous meetings were held explaining the pros and the cons of the project to all the stakeholders, including the Village, the School

District, landowners, Palmer and Liberty Townships, and we believe Avangrid has met any and all requirements.

Therefore, the Palmer Township Trustees are requesting the Ohio Power Siting Board to expedite their decision by granting the permit to construct as soon as possible, and allow the Powell Creek project to move forward. Thank you, Palmer Township Trustees. That's it.

I mentioned agriculture earlier, and the agriculture industry sent a very strong message of support when the farmers and landowners committed their property to this project, something they never would do unless they believed it was important and would bring positive results.

The health, safety, and future of our community will benefit greatly by this project, and it is my hope that it continues without any delays. Thanks again.

I know this Board is fully educated about the environmental and financial benefits of renewable energy projects such as this one, so if you'll allow, I would like to briefly share with you the direct benefits that the Powell Creek Solar project would have for the Village of Miller City and for its most prized asset, the Miller City/New Cleveland Local School District.

The fortunes of a rural town and its affiliated School District often go hand in hand. The Villages of Miller City and New Cleveland are both terrific places to live and raise a family.

Similarly, the Miller City/Cleveland

Local School District is, by any measure, one of the highest performing schools in the entire State of

Ohio year in and year out, thereby appealing to families who want the best education for their children. The only missing ingredient is the opportunity for growth. This project serves as that opportunity.

2.1

The revenue generated from the Powell Creek Solar project would subsequently create an opening for the Village of Miller City to install a much needed sanitary system.

What would naturally follow would be residential housing development, followed by increased school enrollment, and hopefully in the long term, some industry.

All these things serve as tangible benefits to the Village, the school, and the surrounding community. However, without this project, none of that would be realized and the chance for Village and school growth with vanish.

I want to end my testimony by expressing my appreciation to all of the project stakeholders and their years long commitment. Mr. Jeff Reinkemeyer of Avangrid Renewables, along with Mr. Martin Kuhlman, the Village and Township representatives, and of course, the landowners.

All have sacrificed a multitude of hours

working together to bring this potential project to where it is today. They all did so because they recognize, as I do, the importance of this one-time opportunity to make a difference in the future of the Village, the surrounding community, and the Miller City/New Cleveland local school district.
