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ALJ DAVIS: The Ohio Power Siting
Board has set for hearing at this time and place
Case No. 20-1380-EL-BGN which is captioned In
the Matter of the Application of Ross County
Solar, LLC, for a Certificate of Environmental
Compatibility and Public Need.

Good morning, everyone. Welcome aboard. My name is Jesse Davis, with me is Jay Agranoff, we are Administrative Law Judges in the Legal Department of OPSB, the Ohio Power Siting Board. And we have been assigned to this proceeding by the Board, which is Case No. 20-1380-EL-BGN.

At this time we will take appearances of the parties. On behalf of the Applicant.

MR. SETTINERI: Yes. Good morning,
Your Honor. On behalf of Ross County Solar,
LLC, Michael Settineri, Anna Sanyal, and Mark
Hylton, with the law firm of Vorys, Sater,
Seymour and Pease, 52 East Gay Street, Columbus,
Ohio 43215.

ALJ DAVIS: Thank you, counsel. I would point out that this hearing is taking place pursuant to the parameters set forth in the entry of April 21st, 2021, which the joint motion for a continuance of the case was

granted. Due to the Covid 19 emergency that remains in effect under Executive Order 2020-01D issued by the Governor of Ohio, today's hearing is being held through Webex which enables interested persons to offer testimony on the proposed project by telephone or video by the internet.

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And with the preliminaries out of the way, my understanding is that the parties have been in communication, and, Mr. Settineri, do you have an update for us concerning the potential future dates?

MR. SETTINERI: I think that would be a conversation, Your Honor, we should have amongst the parties with you. And if we can do that off the record that may be preferable for starters.

Currently I think the original in our motion was to have a May 7th filing of the stipulation. The parties are engaged in settlement discussions, and I think we can represent there is progress being made there.

And we had planned to come back for hearing I believe the week of May 17th. At this point in time though I don't have -- I think we

need to have a conversation, probably off the record, just to talk about the timing and the ability of certificate parties to meet and either review or approve or decide what to do with the stipulation.

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So I will stop there and hopefully gave you enough information for starters.

ALJ DAVIS: Thank you. Judge

Agranoff, do you have anything you want to add?

ALJ AGRANOFF: Not at this time,

other than are the parties to this point in

agreement with what Mr. Settineri represented?

I will take silence as a yes.

Okay. If it would be preferable that we have that discussion off the record, then let's go off the record at this time. And have counsel take the lead in our discussions.

(DISCUSSION OFF THE RECORD)

ALJ AGRANOFF: Let's go back on the record. We have had a conversation off the record regarding the potential for establishing a schedule going forward in this matter. And, Mr. Settineri, if you would please kind of give us a synopses to where those conversations have resulted?

MR. SETTINERI: Yes. Thank you,
Your Honor, for allowing us to have those
conversations off the record.

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Again, we had initially expected a May 7th filing for a stipulation to the extent one is reached. Given the timing and the ability of all parties to meet and evaluate a stip and decide on whether to join the stip, we, the parties, I will represent have discussed that and believe that May 11th would be an appropriate deadline to file a stipulation in this proceeding. We think that would give the parties enough time to consider and evaluate and decide what to do on the stipulation.

If a stipulation is reached and filed we would expect that testimony supporting a stipulation will be filed by May 14th, Friday. And we would then, assuming that there is no opposing testimony to the stipulation, then we would come back to hearing on the week of May 17th, potentially May 19th or May 20th, and that would be subject to confirmation of witness availability.

ALJ AGRANOFF: Okay. And then as part of that potential schedule in terms of

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the filing of staff and/or intervenor testimony, that would be coincident to the filing of the sponsoring testimony?
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MR. SETTINERI: I will defer to Staff and Mr. Marks on that question, but that would be something that work quite well.

MR. LINDGREN: That is my understanding as well, Your Honor.

ALJ AGRANOFF: Okay.

MR. MARKS: Me also, Your Honor.

ALJ AGRANOFF: So we have May 14th as the date for the filing of sponsoring and/or intervenor and Staff testimony. And then subject to the communications between the parties just confirming the availability of witnesses, once that has been provided to the Bench then at that point in time we will put out an entry that will memorialize the schedule we just discussed as well as establishing the date certain for the hearing date.

Okay. Any other questions?

MR. SETTINERI: No, Your Honor.
