{¶ 1} The Dayton Power and Light Company (DP&L or the Company) is an electric light company and a public utility as defined in R.C. 4905.03 and R.C. 4905.02, respectively. As such, DP&L is subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.

{¶ 2} On November 30, 2020, DP&L filed applications for an increase in electric distribution rates, for accounting authority, and for approval of revised tariffs.

{¶ 3} Pursuant to R.C. 4909.19, the Commission caused an investigation to be made of the facts set forth in the rate increase application, the exhibits attached thereto, and the matters connected therewith. On July 26, 2021, Staff filed a written report of its investigation (Staff Report), copies of which were mailed to the company and other persons deemed interested in the case.

{¶ 4} Pursuant R.C. 4909.19 and Ohio Adm.Code 4901-1-28(B), all objections to a Staff Report must be filed within 30 days after the filing of such report. All objections must be specific; any objection that lacks the specificity required to convey what is actually being placed at issue will be stricken pursuant to Ohio Adm.Code 4901-1-28(B).

{¶ 5} Motions to strike objections to the Staff Report should be filed by September 1, 2021, and memoranda contra motions to strike objections shall be filed by September 8, 2021. Unless an objection is struck or withdrawn, each objection must be discussed in the initial post-hearing brief of the objecting party. If the objection is not discussed in that initial brief, the objections will be deemed withdrawn without further action.

{¶ 6} Direct expert testimony should be filed in accordance with Ohio Adm.Code 4901-1-29.

{¶ 7} A prehearing conference will be held on September 16, 2021, at 10:00 a.m. in Hearing Room 11-A at the offices of the Commission, 180 East Broad Street, 11th Floor, Columbus, Ohio 43215-3793. The purpose of the conference will be to discuss procedural aspects of the case and to provide an opportunity to conduct settlement discussions.

{¶ 8} The evidentiary hearing in this proceeding will commence on October 4, 2021, at 10:00 a.m., in Hearing Room 11-A at the offices of the Commission, 180 East Broad Street, 11th Floor, Columbus, Ohio 43215-3793.

{¶ 9} To participate in the prehearing conference and/or evidentiary hearing, parties should register at the lobby desk and then proceed to the 11th floor. Consistent with Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidelines, individuals who are not fully vaccinated should continue to wear a face covering and practice social distancing. Any accommodations necessary to ensure availability of social distancing and plexiglass dividers should be made in advance of the hearing by contacting the Commission's legal department at 614-466-6843. As pandemic restrictions continue to evolve, instructions regarding further safety requirements or accommodations for the hearing room be will either be posted on the Commission website or communicated to the parties.

{¶ 10} The local public hearings will be scheduled by subsequent entry, which entry will also provide instructions for publication of notice of such hearings.

{¶ 11} Motions to intervene in this proceeding should be filed by August 25, 2021.

{¶ 12} It is, therefore,

{¶ 13} ORDERED, That the prehearing conference in this proceeding be scheduled for September 16, 2021, as stated in Paragraph 7. It is, further,

{¶ 14} ORDERED, That the evidentiary hearing in this proceeding be scheduled for October 4, 2021, as stated in Paragraph 8. It is, further,

{¶ 15} ORDERED, That all interested persons comply with the time frames established in Paragraphs 4, 5, 6, and 11. It is, further,

{¶ 16} ORDERED, That a copy of this Entry be served upon all parties of record.
