Structure Chart

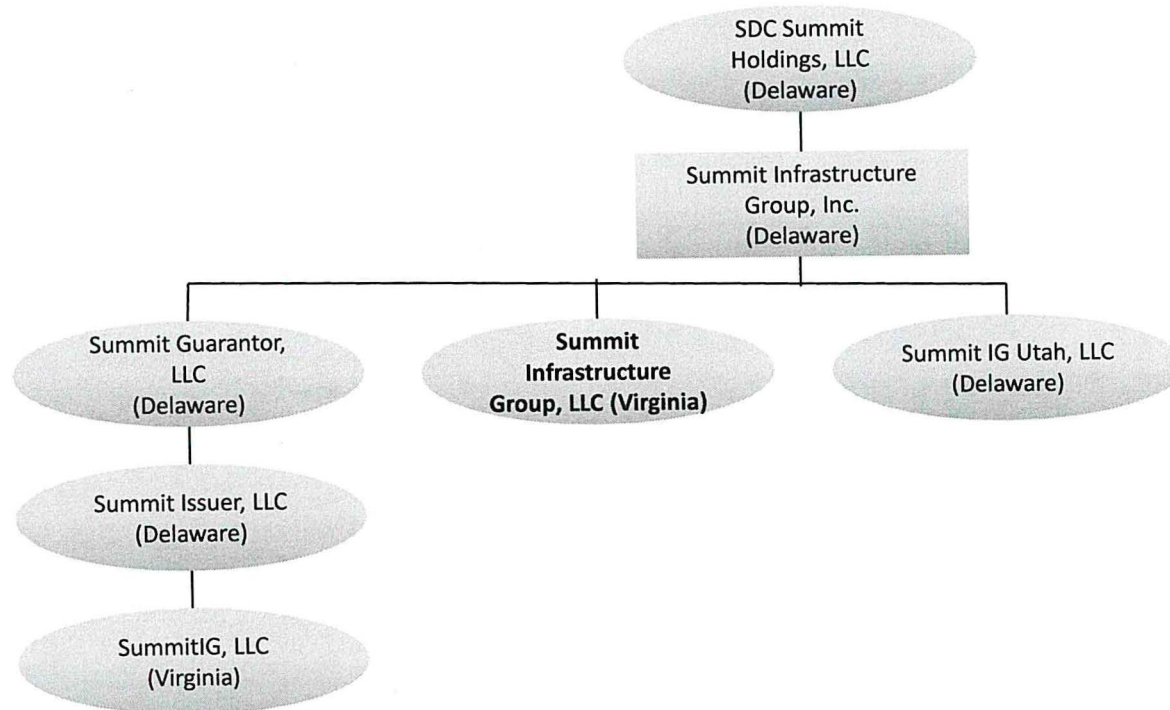


