Jurisdiction of Operation: Plus is a new business and, as of the date of this filing, is not authorized to provide retail/wholesale electric or natural gas services. As explained further below, three of Applicants' affiliates, which are subsidiaries of AES, provide electric supply service to customers in Ohio, Indiana, and Virginia.

First, Applicant is affiliated with The Dayton Power and Light Company d/b/a AES Ohio ('AES Ohio'), a company that transmits, distributes, and sells electricity to retail customers in a 6,000 square mile area of Southwest Ohio. AES Ohio is regulated as a distribution utility by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio. AES Ohio has the exclusive right to provide retail transmission and distribution services to its customers. Additionally, AES Ohio procures retail 'standard service offer' electric service on behalf of its customers that are not served by a CRES.

Second, Applicant is affiliated with Indianapolis Power & Light Company d/b/a AES Indiana ('AES Indiana'), which is engaged primarily in generating, transmitting, distributing, and selling electric energy to retail customers in the city of Indianapolis and neighboring areas within the state of Indiana. As the local electric utility, AES Indiana has an exclusive right to provide electric service to those customers. AES Indiana is regulated as a utility by the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission of Indiana. AES Indiana's service area covers about 528 square miles. AES Indiana owns and operates four generating stations, all within the state of Indiana. Third, Applicant is affiliated with AES Solutions Management, LLC, a competitive service provider of electricity in the Commonwealth of Virginia. AES Solutions Management, LLC sells electricity supply service at retail to eligible commercial and industrial customers in the service territories of Dominion and NOVEC.

Plus was founded in April 2020 and as the date of this filing it has approximately 3200 customers in Indiana.

Plus is a mobile customer engagement app, that aims to improve the customer experience around energy usage monitoring, flexible bill payment options, access to green energy and other customer benefits. Through the app, Plus will provide a set of features and value-added services designed to improve customer interest and engagement in their energy usage. These features include:

- Plus Energy Subscription: Plus will offer an individualized subscription plan for customers in Ohio. This plan will simplify the billing experience as customers will receive one flat bill each month from Plus that includes both the utility cost and the generation cost. Upon enrollment, Plus analyzes a subscriber's historical energy consumption to calculate a monthly flat-bill rate for the customer for a one-year term. This rate guarantees the subscriber "all-you-use" energy service within predefined, reasonable usage limits and excluding non-standard behaviors (e.g., bitcoin mining). Core to this offering is the fact that both the utility and the supplier are made whole on a monthly basis for the energy delivered to the customer. Each month, Plus will pay the utility and the supplier the full customer bill.
- **Simplified billing via credit card/digital wallet**: Payments via credit card or digital wallet (e.g., Apple Pay, Google Pay) are expected to be the standard payment channel for users of Plus mobile app, rather than the current channels, such as ACH transfer or credit payment via a 3rd party, that are both more limited and more cumbersome.
- Split-pay billing: The app will provide Split-pay feature that enables customers to easily
 split monthly payments among multiple parties. This will smooth the billing process for a
 diverse set of customer types, such groups of roommates or adults caring for aging
 relatives on fixed incomes.
- Mobile-specific usage and billing monitoring: The app will provide easy access to
 monthly usage data, provide tips and tools to help reduce energy usage, and generally
 improve customer access to individualized information about their energy consumption
 and billing.
- Other services. From time-to-time, Plus may develop other services that would be offered to customer.

Customer service is a priority for Plus. Any time a customer has an inquiry or complaint, Plus has a team of customer service agents that can provide help to the customer.

Diagram B-2: Plus Subscription Model





