HEARING DECISION

At your request, the Department of Motor Vehicles conducted an administrative hearing on October 13, 2021, by telephone pursuant to *Va. Code* §§ 2.2-4020 and 46.2-706. After having carefully reviewed all of the evidence, I have decided that you showed cause why the order of suspension (Order) issued on February 1, 2021, pursuant to *Va. Code* §§ 46.2-706 and 46.2-707 should not be enforced. Therefore, that Order is hereby canceled.

You should notify your insurance company that the form SR-22 it filed for you is no longer required for this matter. The money that you paid will be refunded to you by the Treasurer's Office. You should receive the refund within eight weeks. If you have not received your refund after eight weeks, you may contact DMV Customer Service at (804) 497-7100.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

1. You registered your 2009 Yamaha (VIN: JYARN23E39A003912), uninsured and without paying the uninsured motor vehicle fee.
2. DMV requested that you insure the vehicle, pay the uninsured motor vehicle fee, or return the license plates by January 25, 2021. You failed to comply by that date, and DMV issued an order of suspension to you on February 1, 2021.
3. You requested an administrative hearing, and DMV held the order of suspension in abeyance.
4. You provided evidence sufficient to cancel the order of suspension.

CONCLUSION OF LAW:

There is cause why the order of suspension issued to you on February 1, 2021, should not be enforced. *Va. Code* §§ 46.2-706 and 46.2-707.

In the future please be aware that Virginia law still requires that any motor vehicle registered or being registered in Virginia must be an insured motor vehicle or the uninsured motor vehicle fee must be paid. **This decision applies only to the above-referenced Order and does not apply to any other Order.**
