Commission of Ohio has assigned for public hearing at this time and place, Case Nos. 20-1651-EL-AIR,

20-1652-EL-AAM, and 20-1653-EL-ATA, being In the Matter of the Application of The Dayton Power and Light Company for an Increase in Electric

Distribution Rates, for Accounting Authority, and for Approval of Revised Tariffs.

My name is Patricia Schabo, with me this evening is Michael Williams, and we are the attorney examiners who have been assigned by the Commission to preside over this hearing.

MR. DOVE: Good evening, Your Honor. On behalf of Ohio Partners for Affordable Energy, this is Robert Dove with the law firm of Kegler, Brown, Hill & Ritter, 65 East State Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215.

EXAMINER SCHABO: Thank you so much.

All right. I do not see any other intervenors, but if you are counsel for an intervenor and you are on the call, please speak up.

All right. The subject of this public hearing is AES Ohio's application for an increase in electric distribution rates, which is accompanied by an application for approval of accounting authority and of revised tariffs.

AES Ohio filed its application on November 30, 2020. AES Ohio is requesting to increase its revenue requirement by approximately \$121 million.

The Commission Staff filed its report and recommendation on July 26, 2021. In its report, Staff recommends limiting the increase to a range of between \$61.1 million and \$66.7 million. Staff's report is a recommendation only, and the final decision will ultimately be made by the Commission.

This local public hearing, as were the two held in September in downtown Dayton, is only one aspect of the process.

The evidentiary hearing is currently scheduled for December 7, 2021, again via Webex. The evidentiary hearing is where the Company, Staff, and intervening parties will present testimony and other evidence regarding the Company's application.

Details for observing the evidentiary hearing are included in an entry dated October 19,

2021, and are available on the Commission's website by viewing the calendar and clicking on "Go To Event Detail."
