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MOTION OF INDUSTRIAL ENERGY USERS-OHIO TO INTERVENE AND MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT

Industrial Energy Users-Ohio ("IEU-Ohio") respectfully moves the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio ("Commission"), pursuant to R.C. 4903.221 and Ohio Adm.Code 4901-1-11, for leave to intervene in the above-captioned matter with the full powers and rights granted by the Commission, specifically by statute or by the provisions of the Ohio Administrative Code, to intervening parties.

On April 25, 2018, the Commission approved, with modification, a stipulation and recommendation regarding the application filed by Ohio Power Company d/b/a AEP Ohio ("AEP Ohio") to implement an electric security plan ("ESP"). AEP Ohio's ESP was approved for a term of June 1, 2018, through May 31, 2024. Pursuant to R.C.

4928.143(F), the Commission must annually evaluate the earnings of AEP Ohio under its ESP to determine whether the ESP produces significantly excessive earnings for the electric utility. Further, pursuant to R.C. 4928.143(E), the Commission must test the plan in the fourth year (the quadrennial review) to determine whether the ESP, including its then-existing pricing and all other terms and conditions, continues to be more favorable in the aggregate, and during the remaining term of the ESP, as compared to the expected results that would otherwise apply under a Market Rate Offer. Accordingly, in these cases, the Commission will review AEP Ohio's earnings in 2019 and 2020 and will conduct the quadrennial review of AEP Ohio.

IEU-Ohio's members include customers of AEP Ohio who pay the rates and charges that result in AEP Ohio's earnings. Accordingly, resolution of this matter may directly affect rates and charges paid by IEU-Ohio members. As demonstrated further in the Memorandum in Support, IEU-Ohio has a direct, real, and substantial interest in the issues and matters involved in the above-captioned proceedings and is so situated that the disposition of this proceeding may, as a practical matter, impair or impede its ability to protect that interest. IEU-Ohio believes that its participation will not unduly prolong or delay this proceeding and that it will significantly contribute to the full development and equitable resolution of the factual and other issues. The interests of IEU-Ohio will not be adequately represented by other parties to the proceeding and, as such, IEU-Ohio is entitled to intervene with the full powers and rights granted by the Commission, specifically by statute and by the provisions of Commission rules to intervening parties.
