Dear Mr. O'Dell:

This letter is in response to your email inquiry made on August 25, 2021 to Cody Logan at Invenergy regarding the presence of noxious weeds at the Hardin Solar Energy facility, commonly referred to as Hardin I.

In response to your inquiries, we provide the following information:

1. Explain the circumstances which led to the amount of noxious weeds present within the project area.

Prior to the completion of construction in February 2021, long-term ground cover, consisting of low-growing warm and cool season grasses, was planted. In some areas of the project, site work was finalized and seeding occurred earlier in the winter of 2020. The seed coverage in these areas seeded earlier did not fully take, and as a result, these areas were re-seeded in the spring of 2021. Delay in the establishment of long-term ground cover allowed weeds to grow.

Additionally, due to employee and equipment availability, the Hardin I vegetation management contractor did not begin mowing efforts until July 2021 further hindering efforts to control the growth of undesirable weeds.

2. Describe the steps that will be taken to control noxious weeds through implementation of the vegetation management plan in compliance with condition 22.

Monitoring of the vegetation throughout the site will include identifying the presence of invasive or unwanted species and the extent of their occurrence. Should any invasive species be identified within the site, the invasive species shall be removed using methods most likely to be effective in controlling that species. Where necessary, the affected area will be reseeded. Overall, vegetation management will include a combination of scheduled mowing, herbicide applications, and seeding as needed with appropriate mixes.



3. Provide a timeline of when the noxious weed issue would likely be resolved.

The Hardin I vegetation management contractor commenced work mowing the site on July 19, 2021. To date, 17 of 40 blocks have been mown as have all project areas outside of the project fence. Mowing is expected to be complete by the end of October, 2021. Herbicide treatment across the site is scheduled to commence September 13, 2021. Spraying will occur in each block following the completion of mowing in that block. The herbicide treatment will be complete by the end of the year.
