The Ohio Chamber is the state's leading business advocate, and we represent thousands of companies that do business in Ohio. Our mission is to aggressively champion free enterprise, economic competitiveness and growth for the benefit of all Ohioans.

As such, we are writing today in support of the South Branch Solar project. This project will bring significant economic development to Ohio and Northwest Ohio specifically, including \$1 million annually to the Hancock County economy and over \$600,000 annually to Arcadia Local Schools.
