 - A. I don't know.
- Q. Okay. You don't know if you are speculating, or you don't know if there are still members?
 - A. I don't know what their positions are.
 - Q. Okay.

- A. They are not in the record.
- Q. The fact that Allen County entered into an MOU with the Applicant would indicate to you, would it not, that their concerns similarly have been addressed related to the project?
- A. As far as the roads and bridges, that type of issue, yes.
- Q. Okay. And similarly Auglaize County entering into the DRUMA would indicate their concerns related to drainage, road use, and maintenance have been addressed by the Applicant; is that accurate?

- A. I would assume because they have signed the Stipulation, yes.
- Q. Okay. Your testimony refers to letters received -- and feel free to look at page 5. It refers to letters received in public opposition.

 Those letters were received before Auglaize County entered into the drainage and road use agreement, correct?
- A. To the best of my knowledge, there could have been other letters that were received on the docket after that point but that's true.
- Q. When you reference letters, you are referring to letters that were submitted on the -- in the public comment section of the docket.
 - A. Yes, sir.

- Q. Okay. Do you make any effort to verify the authenticity of those letters?
- A. No, sir. They are entered into the record. I do not specifically take any independent action to verify their authenticity.
- Q. You made no effort to verify the individual who signed that document actually authored or drafted that document?

entered into the docket prior to the time that the DRUMA was entered into between Auglaize County and Applicant, correct?

A. I believe so.

- Q. And those public comments were filed in the docket prior to the time that the MOU was executed between Allen County and the Applicant, correct?

- Q. Okay. So as you sit here today, do you know whether -- you can't say whether or not Allen County still has concerns related to the project, correct?
- A. I know that they have not changed their original position in a public manner by stating that they are now not opposed to the project, but they have signed the agreements that you talked about.
- Q. Would signing the agreements indicate lack of opposition to the project?
- A. Signing the agreements would mean that issue has been resolved by those folks, that particular issue, whatever is contained in that particular Stipulation. However, the general opposition to the project, the local public officials still have voiced opposition to the project.

- Q. There's no local officials here today sitting at counsel table and participating in these proceedings, are there?
 - A. There are not -- I don't believe so.
- Q. We've heard from the Coalition. And what is the Coalition? Do you understand what that group is?
- A. Yes. I believe it's a coalition of folks on the other side who are in favor of the project.
- Q. When you say in favor of the project, you are aware, are you not, that those are residents of the counties Auglaize and Allen who are proponents of the project, correct?
 - A. Yes.

- Q. And they have actually filed to intervene in this case; is that right?
 - A. Yes.
- Q. In fact, they are the only local interest represented in this case who has actually filed testimony; is that right?
 - A. Yes.
- Q. They are the only local residents who are here today participating in this proceeding, correct?

 - Q. So as of today, there is nobody sitting

in this room who is opposed to the project participating in these proceedings, correct?

- A. Sitting in the room.
- Q. In terms of the Staff Report, it did not recommend denial of the certificate based on public interest, correct?

 - Q. Okay.
 - A. Yes.

 beginning at line 16, the sentence "Staff believes
 that the public opposition will create negative
 impacts on the local community." Specifically what
 public opposition are you referring to?
 - A. The public opposition both -- as represented by individual folks in the community that may participate and wrote comment to us as well as the local government officials representing their

constituents and their opposition to the project.

- Q. That sentence carries on -- well, I will start from the beginning again. "Staff believes that the public opposition will create negative impacts on the local community. Board Staff believes that any benefits to the local community are outweighed by this overwhelming public opposition and, therefore, the project would not serve the public interest, convenience, and necessity." Did I read that correctly?
 - A. That's correct, sir.
 - Q. Did you draft those two sentences?
- A. That's correct. You read that correctly, sir.
- Q. My question is did you draft those two sentences?
- A. Yes, along with, as I have a stated before, the Staff Report and all of the works are collaborative efforts; but, yes, I drafted these two sentences.
- Q. Thank you. Other than the public comments that were filed in this case, since the issuance of the Staff Report and your testimony being filed in this action, what changed the Staff's position on public necessity?

- A. Staff's position -- Staff was, as I stated in my testimony, concerned at the time of the Staff Report regarding the public interest, convenience, and necessity. While Stipulations and other actions have occurred, Staff still recognizes that those positions are still maintained by those local elected officials. There is a couple of examples in my testimony obviously.
- Q. At the time of the filing of the Staff Report, there was opposition to this project, correct?
- A. At the time of the filing of the Staff Report?
 - O. Yes.

2.1

- A. There was opposition to this project, correct. There was opposition, yes.
- Q. Yet Staff did not recommend denial based upon public interest, correct?
- A. Yes. You had asked me that question before. Staff did note its concerns, and Staff was -- at that point this is a process that we go through, and so we realized that there were analyses at that time of the Staff Report that was outstanding such as the aforementioned concern over cultural resources, the aforementioned concern over oil and

gas wells, and the concerns of the local governmental officials in opposition to the project. So those were all present at the time of the Staff Report. We expressed those concerns in the Staff Report and noted those.

- Q. But at the time of the issuance of the Staff Report, the local public official concerns were not grounds in the Staff's minds for recommending denial based upon public interest, correct?
- A. We received many comments throughout the local -- from local constituents throughout this process. They are numerous. I can't recall them all.
- Q. But at the time of the issuance of the Staff Report, staff was aware that certain local public officials were opposed to the project, correct?
 - A. Yes.

- Q. Okay. But at the time of the issuance of the Staff Report, the local public official opposition was not deemed by Staff to be grounds to deny the certificate based on public interest, correct?
- A. Staff expressed its concerns at that time.

- Q. If you could turn back to page 47 of the Staff Report, Staff Exhibit 1. I am looking at the section "Recommended Findings."
 - A. Page 47, sir?
 - Q. Yes, sir.
 - A. Okay. Go ahead.
- Q. Actually if you look just above that section, just above the "Recommended Findings" section, the heading is "Effect of Revised Code 4906.10(A)(2) and (A)(3) Review." Do you see that?
- 11 A. Yes, sir.

- Q. Those are probable environmental impact sections, correct?
 - A. Yes. Referring to the nature of the environment, prob -- the problem nature of the environment, and minimum adverse impact.
- Q. Okay. And then the recommended findings also state "While Staff is concerned with Applicant -- Applicant's satisfaction of the requirements specified in Revised Code 4906.10(A)(6), pending the submission of information, analyses, and processes in this case, Staff recommends that the Board find that the proposed facility would serve the public interest." When you -- when the Staff Report refers to "submission of information, analyses, and

processes," does that not refer to the archeological report as well as the engineering and constructability report?

- A. Those were two of the analyses that Staff did not have at the time. And those were two of the areas being considered, yes.
- Q. And those relate to the probable environmental impact, correct?
 - A. Yes, sir.

MR. SECREST: Your Honor, may we have a moment?

12 ALJ WILLIAMS: You may.

Let's go off the record.

- Q. Thank you. And I do not know if you have a copy of Shanelle Montana's supplemental testimony. Is that 30A?
 - A. I do not.

County has expressed to the OPSB its desire to enact into a -- to enter into a formal agreement related to the use and repair of County roads and drainage systems with the Developer prior to the commencement of construction of the Project (a DRUMA), D-R-U-M-A, and only in the event the project," and only in the event the project "is approved by the Ohio Power Siting Board."

- Q. And further down the one, two, three, four, fifth, "WHEREAS," that first sentence.
- 11 A. Yes. "BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS."
 - Q. No.

- A. "ALLEN COUNTY."
- Q. It says "The Parties desire to enter into a MOU to formalize their agreement."
- A. Could you direct me to where you are referring to, please?
 - Q. It's the fifth WHEREAS clause.
- A. Yes. This is -- this states "WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into a MOU to formalize their agreement that the Parties will continue to negotiate a DRUMA in good faith and, in the event Certificate -- and in the event that a Certificate is granted, the Parties will enter into the DRUMA that

is mutually acceptable to the Developer and the County prior to the commencement of construction of the Project. 'Continue good faith negotiations' will be defined as using the DRUMA as executed by the Allen County and development -- and Auglaize County and Developer on May 5, 2022, as a baseline for the Allen County DRUMA, acknowledging that the Allen County has a greater portion of the project and therefore has greater needs both regarding drainage and road infrastructure."

- Q. Thank you. Does that indicate support of the project or how would you interpret that?
- A. It merely indicates that they've agreed in good faith if the Board issues a certificate, that in these two particular issues, they would want the Board to codify this and to approve this. It does not mean that they approve of the project in its entirety.
- Q. Thank you. This is the Resolution.

 Could we move on back to the actual memorandum in the next page.
 - A. Memorandum of Understanding.
- Q. And we are getting into the WHEREASes again. I'm looking at the third WHEREAS. And this is just an agreement strictly related to the repair

of road -- road and drainage systems, correct?

A. Correct.

- Q. And further on down, the fifth WHEREAS, could you please read that.
- A. Yes, sir -- yes, ma'am. "WHEREAS, the Parties acknowledge that DRUMA would be unnecessary if the Certificate is not granted by the OPSB."
- Q. Okay. And so there is nothing in either the Resolution or the Memorandum of Understanding that shows support of the project.
- A. It simply means they've reached agreement on those particular issues, but they still believe those issues would not be necessary as they have stated, and they would only be necessary in the event that the Board granted a certificate. It doesn't change the county's opposition.
- Q. Thank you. And I wanted to touch on another issue also. What was the date that your testimony was filed? Is that May 11? It should say on the front.
 - A. May 11.
- Q. Okay. And the date of this Memorandum of Understanding is May 12, correct? What you were just reading.
- A. Yes, that's correct.

- Q. And also talking about the process that has been the subject of today a lot, were there public hearings after the Staff Report was filed?

 A. Yes.
- Q. And is that part of the process that you are talking about?
- A. Yes. There was a process of continuing investigation that will occur throughout the hearing -- the entire hearing process that we engage in.
- MS. BAIR: Thank you, your Honor. I have nothing further.

ALJ WILLIAMS: Thank you.

I am going to have -- the Bench has a couple of questions, and then we will let you recross following our questions to make sure you are able to be as thorough as you want to be.

Q. So, Mr. O'Dell, at the time of the Staff Report, October 20 of 2021, do you recall, had you heard from any or all of the local communities? By local communities I am defining Shawnee Township, Logan Township, and Allen and Auglaize Counties.

- A. It is my understanding they all remain opposed to the project.
