



It was 62 years ago (in 1960) yesterday that the new 50-star American flag, designed by Robert Heft (former mayor of Napoleon), honoring Hawaii's admission as a state, was unfurled for the first time.

In January of 1959, Alaska was admitted into the Union. July 4 of that year, the 49-star flag became official, but it was short-lived. By the end of August, Eisenhower signed a proclamation adding Hawaii to the Union, as Heft had predicted. Congressman Moeller brought Heft's

flag to the design committee, where Eisenhower himself selected the flag to become the national emblem. On July 4, 1960, Heft and Eisenhower stood together in Washington to watch the first 50-star flag be raised.


