Founded in 1995, Environ Energy, LLC f/k/a Hospital Energy, LLC serves as the energy procurement and development arm for several of the nations' leading healthcare group purchasing organizations (GPOs), including Premier Healthcare Alliance, which represent more than 2,000 healthcare institutions in the United States. We serve hospitals in all major U.S. markets, providing services that include energy procurement, efficiency, resiliency, and sustainability.

We are the authors of American Hospital Association (AHA) Best Practices in Energy Procurement (2017) and Business Planning for Energy Resiliency (2018).

Environ Energy, LLC f/k/a Hospital Energy, LLC's ability to organize internal hospital decision-making, aggregate Environ Energy, LLC f/k/a Hospital Energy, LLC spend to drive savings and provide leading ledge financial analytics set us apart from other advisors operating in the healthcare sector.

In 2017, Environ Energy, LLC f/k/a Hospital Energy, LLC moved to New Hampshire and incorporated there. Corporate ownership and management did not change as a result of this move.

On December 31,2017, Hospital Energy, LLC, a Connecticut limited liability company solely owned by Mark Mininberg, merged with and into Mininberg EEC, now known as Hospital Energy, LLC, a New Hampshire limited liability company also wholly owned by Mark Mininberg. As of July 31, 2020, Hospital Energy has undergone a change in ownership pursuant to which Hospital Energy Holding Company, LLC, a Massachusetts limited liability company, has acquired all of the ownership interest of Hospital Energy. Hospital Energy will continue conducting business as Hospital Energy, LLC, and the company's business operations, services and customer population will also remain unchanged.

On September 3, 2021, Environ Energy, LLC f/k/a Hospital Energy, LLC purchased a material portion of the business assets of Gotham Energy 360, LLC, a New York limited liability company (Certificate No. 16-1124E). Environ Energy, LLC f/k/a Hospital Energy, LLC intends to perform any Ohio-related customer contracts acquired from Gotham under its existing competitive retail electric service provider certificates and/or competitive retail natural gas service provider certificates.

On October 19, 2021, Hospital Energy, LLC, changed its assumed name in the State of Ohio from "Hospital Energy, LLC" to "Environ Energy, LLC." An official letter of notification was sent to the PUC of OH on November 8, 2021 regarding these matters and a copy of that letter is attached and labeled as Attachment A-13-1.
