LE Energy is currently conducting business as an Alternative Gas Supplier in the State of Michigan under the DBA Michigan Natural Gas, and as an Alternative Gas Supplier in the State of Illinois under the DBA Utility Gas and Power, and as a Competitive Retail Natural Gas Supplier and Competitive Retail Electric Supplier in the State of Ohio doing business as Utility Gas and Power.

The two principles of Utility Gas and Power are Cliff Hare and Philip Cato.

Cliff Hare:


