ALJ DAVIS: Okay. We are on the record.

The Ohio Power Siting Board has scheduled for public hearing at this time and place Case No.

21-199-EL-BTX which is captioned in the Matter of the Application of AEP Ohio Transmission Company,

Incorporated, for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need to Construct the Groves Road-Shannon Transmission Line Project in Franklin County, Ohio.

My name is Jesse Davis. I am the

Administrative Law Judge with the Board assigned to
hear this case and conduct tonight's hearing. There
are other Board Staff members here in the back there
towards the desk and there is another gentleman with
the Board who should be in here shortly.

If you have questions about the Board's process or the application process, you can feel free to talk to them or any other kind of questions concerning what's upcoming in the case in terms of how the hearings go or things like that, you can feel free to talk to them. Or if you have written comments you would like to file in the docket, they

can answer those questions.

At this time I think what I would like to do is take appearance of counsel for the parties. So if we have counsel for the Applicant.

MR. McKENZIE: Yeah. Shelby Mann with AEP Ohio Transco. Also with me is Hector Garcia-Santana.

ALJ DAVIS: Thank you. I don't have counsel for anyone else. Okay. So thank you very much.

So with that said, the subject of today's hearing is an application filed by AEP Ohio

Transmission Company, Incorporated, hereafter referred to as AEP, for the purpose of constructing a new approximately 5 to 7 mile long 138 kilovolt transmission line through Blacklick Estates, the City of Columbus, Village of Brice, and Truro and Madison Townships in Franklin County, Ohio.

The proposed transmission line will connect the Groves Road Station to the Shannon Station. The applicant -- application was filed on March 8, 2022. AEP contends the project, if approved and completed, aims to improve the reliability of the electric transmission grid in Franklin County, Ohio, and is part of the overall southeast Columbus area

improvements project.

Board Staff filed its Report of
Investigation on October 3, 2022. The Staff Report
is a recommendation and does not necessarily reflect
the Board's final determination in this case. I
would note that if anyone would like to read the
Staff Report, it is available in the docket, and if
you have questions about how to access that, you can
certainly ask Mr. Butler in the back there or the
other Board member staff -- Board Staff member is
Andrew Conway. He was also the Staff lead on this
project, so if you have particular questions about
something in the report, you can ask him.

With that said, the purpose of this evening's public hearing is to get -- solicit feedback from the public about the proposed project. So, you know, if you just have opinions or thoughts or any kind of concerns you want to voice, tonight is the time to come up here and testify about those things.

This is only one aspect of the case. The public hearing is just one step in our process. An in-person evidentiary hearing is scheduled in this case, and it will occur in November and that will be at the Board's offices in Columbus. The purpose of

that is for the parties in the case and for Board Staff to provide testimony and other evidence about the project. And that will be what the Board considers in totality when it makes its decision on the approval of the application.

Tonight's hearing is being transcribed by our court reporter, and I would just ask that if you do plan to testify, that you speak kind of loudly and clearly. You know, we are relatively close together but just to make sure she can hear you clearly and get everything transcribed properly.

Also if you have prepared a written statement or have any sort of testimony that's written down and you brought it with you, you can certainly give it to me, and I will make sure it gets to the docket. That would be helpful for ensuring everything's accurate.

After I finish kind of introducing things here, I will begin by inviting individuals on the sign-up sheet here to testify about the proposed project, and each person who signed up will be permitted to speak once about the project. And before you speak, you will be asked to take an oath or affirmation what you state is the truth. And I will ask you to state and spell your name and address

for the record and indicate if you work or reside within the project area, and then you are able to provide your thoughts.

Counsel for the -- for the parties in the case, if they wish, could ask a question about something that you say, and I am also permitted to do so, but you will know. It would certainly be something I would indicate.

And then there will be a final transcript of this hearing that will be transcribed and put into the docket in the case, so anybody can access the docket on our website and go and read that.

And again, if you wish, you can also change your mind and file written comments. That's perfectly fine. I know some folks would rather do that.

And again, once you finish testifying, you are certainly welcome to stick around for anybody else that's going to speak; or you can, of course, leave at any time. We just ask that you do so quietly.

That's pretty much all I have in terms of an introduction. So at this time we will begin with testifying, and it looks like the only person who signed up is Ron Benit.

MR. BENIT: That's me but I need to find out a little bit more about the project because I got some notice about it but I don't know exactly what's going on and I am only interested in how it affects my property.

ALJ DAVIS: Okay. Do you have any thoughts that you would like to get out beforehand, or would you feel like you are just not prepared to provide that without kind of learning more?

MR. BENIT: Well, we did receive some kind of inquiry regarding -- from AEP asking to -- to run lines over our property and take down some structures, and we are not interested in that. So that's all I have to say.

MR. BENIT: Sure.

ALJ DAVIS: Okay. So I would ask you to raise your right hand.

(Witness sworn.)

ALJ DAVIS: Could you please state and spell your name for the record.

MR. BENIT: Ron Benit, B-E-N-I-T.

ALJ DAVIS: And your address.

MR. BENIT: So the property that we're

talking about is at 2440 Brice Road.

ALJ DAVIS: And is that within the project area?

MR. BENIT: I don't know. We got notice regarding that, so I would imagine that they are related. The inquiry was related to this project.

ALJ DAVIS: Thank you. And you can go ahead and say whatever it is.

MR. BENIT: So we received an inquiry from AEP that they wanted to run some lines over -- over our property and take down an existing structure. And, you know, we have plans for that property, and we don't want any high voltage lines running through the property.

ALJ DAVIS: Thank you for your testimony.

MR. BENIT: That's it.
